- * Make childcare reservations on the registration form.
- * Provide a sack lunch for your child in childcare, if your project is expected to extend beyond lunch time.

#1 “Dress a Girl Around the World” Project
 We will stay on site to turn new pillowcases or short lengths of material into dresses that will be distributed on our Peru Mission Trip. Bring scissors, thread and a portable sewing machine or serger, if you have one. **YOUTH AND ADULTS**

#2 Casa Juan Diego
 Bring the whole family and split among the various projects once you get there. Lunch is provided. Return to WCPC by early afternoon.

C Fun with Kids and Moms
 We will make crafts and play games (in English and Spanish) with women and children at the Women’s Shelter. **ALL AGES (UNDER 13 WITH PARENT)**

#3 Tidy Up the Community Clinic
 The Community Clinic in Oak Ridge North is moving toward all digital files and needs help with the transition. We will help scan files and also box up files for outside storage. Our work should conclude by 12 Noon. **ADULTS**

#4 Activities with Seniors
 We will sing, make crafts and mingle with our senior neighbors at The Forum Alzheimer’s Unit and Regent Healthcare. We will return to WCPC before noon. **ALL AGES (UNDER 10 WITH PARENT)**

#5 Habitat for Humanity
 Help out where needed with Montgomery County Habitat for Humanity. Lunch is provided. Return to WCPC in the afternoon. **ADULTS AND YOUTH 16+ YEARS**

#6 Habitat Lunch Crew
 The volunteers at the Habitat project will work up a quite an appetite! Our crew will prepare the lunch and deliver it to the Conroe work site. You will be welcomed with enthusiasm! **YOUTH AND ADULTS**

#7 Montgomery County Food Bank
 The Food Bank needs our help sorting food and tending their community garden. You can choose between the tasks or do both. You will return to WCPC by early afternoon. **ADULTS AND YOUTH 13+ YEARS**



#8 Project Cure
 We will work in the warehouse boxing odd-shaped medical equipment, testing equipment and stacking boxes on pallets. We will return to WCPC by early afternoon. **ADULTS AND YOUTH 16+ YEARS**

#9 Gardens at the Women’s Shelter
 Outdoor gardens at the Montgomery County Women’s Shelter are badly overgrown. This project is for people who love to pull weeds, thin plants and do other outdoor jobs. Return to WCPC by early afternoon. **ADULTS**

#10 Hand Me Up Shop Crew
 Help the people at Interfaith’s Hand Me Up resale shop dig out from under the piles of clothing donations and put their shop in order. We will be back at church shortly after 12 Noon. **HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH AND ADULTS**

#11 Breakfast Cooking Team
 But who will feed the workers? We will! Come help cook, set up, clean up and basically take care of all the good participants. And then you can go home early! **YOUTH AND ADULTS**
