Dear WCPC family:

I know most of us don't like to wait. I know I never have and our culture certainly doesn't help. But waiting can have its own reward. Waiting can be a time of preparation so that when what we are waiting for finally arrives our joy is greater, fuller, richer.

Advent is about waiting and watching and preparing. Advent provides us with the opportunity to think more deeply about both the first coming of Christ into our world, and all those who were part of that story, and his second coming. As Presbyterians we don't spend any time worrying about the "when" of that second coming. Instead while we are waiting we act, in faithfulness, preparing again the way for our Lord as we seek to allow

God to use us in the building of God's Kingdom now. What we often discover is that while we are waiting and working and serving he does come again more fully into our lives.

In Advent we remember the patience of those who longed for a Messiah. We also remember their faithfulness while they were waiting. The prophets who time and time again called God's people back to their covenant relationship, with one another, with their world, and especially with their God. We remember Mary's patience as she struggled with her unconventional pregnancy and her faithfulness to God throughout. We remember John the Baptist as he paved the way – preparing the hearts of those who would listen to the good news that would be realized in Jesus Christ.

We are called to be patient and faithful as well. As we watch the evening news or read the morning newspaper we know that there is so much work yet to be done. It's as near as our own neighborhoods and on the other side of our planet. Lives cut short by hunger and disease. Lives cut short by war and terrorism.

While we are waiting for the hungry to be satisfied; for God's healing to be experienced; for wars and rumors of wars to end; for violence and terror to be no more; we pray and we act. We feed the hungry and advocate for actions that can bring about its end locally and globally. We visit and comfort the sick and the dying. We work for justice and peace realizing how elusive both are in this world that waits. And in all that we do we do not give up hope.

Ultimately that is the good news of Christmas. Our waiting is not in vain. God hasn't forgotten us or God's promises. Long ago, in the tiny, insignificant village, a baby was born. He grew up to speak the truth and live the truth and though he was rejected and finally killed, his story didn't end. Death, the tomb couldn't contain him. His truth, God's truth couldn't be ignored. He lives. And because he lived and lives we have hope as we wait and as we work for God's new creation.


PRAYERS & SQUARES

What do you say when someone is suffering?

How Can We Help?

Dr. Haugk's book speaks to an issue we face. We want to comfort those who are hurting. What should we say or do? Are there things we might say or do that inadvertently make the pain worse? Is it okay at times to say nothing ?

Offering Comfort

Don't Sing Songs to a Heavy Heart offers guidance on comforting people in their time of need. After his own experiences <u>Kenneth C. Haugk</u> wrote this book using research with others who had also experienced suffering in their lives. Using a biblical foundation and acknowledgement of God's grace, *Don't Sing Songs to a Heavy Heart* suggests what to say or do—and what *not* to say or do. It will help readers bring Christ's loving care to hurting people when they need it most.



The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. Christmas Offering 2017

The Christmas Offering is a combination of the Christmas Joy and Christmas Eve offerings. That is, twentyfive percent of the Christmas Offering will go to the PC(USA) Special Christmas Joy Offering, which is split evenly between the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and scholarship funds for Presbyterianrelated racial ethnic schools and colleges. The remaining seventy-five percent will go to purchase textbooks for the CCAP (Church of Central Africa Presbyterian) Synod of Zambia community schools.

Textbooks for CCAP Synod of Zambia Community Schools

Since 2004 CCAP (Church of Central Africa Presbyterian) Synod of Zambia , which is in partnership with PC(USA), has been providing education to orphans and vulnerable children who would not have otherwise gone to school due to financial constraints. The CCAP community school program is church-run with volunteer teachers and is a category recognized and monitored by Zambia's Ministry of Education. The number of CCAP community schools has been increasing and now there are 30 community schools, 10 in Lusaka and 20 in the Lundazi area of Eastern Zambia, that serve over 5,000 students.

Recently the Zambian Ministry of Education changed the curriculum and textbooks to be used in the schools. Consequently, the CCAP Community Schools Coordinator, Mrs. Mabuchi Dokowi, is trying to acquire at least one copy of each textbook for every grade level in all of the 30 community schools. It is estimated that it will cost \$4,000 to purchase these books. PC(USA) through the efforts of Nancy Collins, the Regional Liaison for East Central Africa, is trying to help raise money for these textbooks. After hearing from Nancy when she was on campus in October about the dire need for these textbooks in the CCAP Community Schools, the Mission Outreach Team (MOT) voted at its November meeting to have 75% of the Christmas Offering go to help offset the cost of these necessary textbooks.

Please give generously to the Christmas Offering. Kindly make your check payable to WCPC and mark it for the Christmas Offering, as only checks designated as such as well as cash collected at the two Christmas Eve services will go toward this offering. Specially marked envelopes will also be available in the pew racks for your convenience. When we give out of the abundance of God's blessings in our lives, the light of Christ shines through us and illuminates those in need of help and hope. Thank you for your willingness to help support those in their hour of great need and hour of great promise.

Deng's Computer

About 2 years after Abraham Wei, a Lost Boy from Sudan, came to the U.S. and joined WCPC in 2001, he learned that he had a brother named Deng that he had never met. Deng and another brother, Agot, were stuck in a refugee camp in Kenya, unable to return to their home country of Sudan. In 2004, several members of WCPC expressed interest in providing funds to pay for boarding school for Agot and Deng. These faithful "school sponsors" saw the boys through to attaining their high school certificates. About a year ago, Deng notified us that he had been accepted to medical training in South Sudan. He requested financial support once again, so that he could fulfill his dream to become a medical worker in his home country.

After one year of preliminary training, Deng's school now requires online research and written papers. He has neither smart phone nor computer, and the school computers are usually monopolized by the lecturers. That is where we come in!

We located a Presbyterian mission worker for South Sudan who offered to transport a small laptop from the U.S. to Deng in Juba. Now Deng will be able to complete his assignments. The goal is that someday the people of South Sudan will have another skilled person to offer medical care.
