

The activities are all accessible for children of all ages and adults. This is a wonderful opportunity for the whole family or individuals to begin their Lenten journey. Start in the parking lot and follow the chalk instructions on the sidewalk.

Dear WCPC family:

The season of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 1st this year) is a time for prayer, reflection and preparation for the celebration of Easter. Maybe someone has asked you, "What are they giving up for Lent?" One year I gave up caffeine for Lent – my family, my church family, almost everyone asked me never to do that again!

Lent though is more than just giving something up. Lent is opening ourselves up to what God might do in our lives if we are willing to listen. Lent provides us with the opportunity to examine our discipleship. Maybe we've been standing still or moving away from God, maybe not intentionally but allowing life to just overwhelm us.. My

prayer for myself and for the family of WCPC is that as we walk through this holy season we will be honest with God and ourselves.

This Lent, to help us listen, a devotional will be available entitled "Lent: A Season of Returning." Copies will be available on the Welcome Table in the narthex and in the church office. Since we have a limited number we are asking you take only one for each household. This devotional, beginning with Ash Wednesday and ending with Holy Week, has suggested lectionary passages, short meditations and suggested prayers. It also has a section with questions you can consider and space to record your thoughts.

Of course there are other tools available. The Office of Theology and Worship of the PCUSA has developed a smartphone app for daily prayer. The **Daily Prayer app** provides simple, yet rich devotional resources for morning, midday, evening, and close of day. Each service includes psalms and readings from the confessions. Other elements include opening and closing words, biblical canticles, a thanksgiving for light and a prayer of confession. An advanced features menu allows users to customize which elements appear. You can also request that daily scripture be emailed to you by going to http://www.presbyterianmission.org/ministries/devotions/

It's vital in our spiritual lives that we are intentional. Such intentionality shouldn't be restricted to just a season like Lent, but Lent can provide us with habits developed that can last us a lifetime.

Dear Ones,

We begin this month as we begin the great forty days of Lent. In this season we find ourselves on a journey together. Often we find our focus this season on the fasting and the repenting. I can't tell you how many times I am asked (including by myself), "What are you giving up for Lent this year?" However, scholars tell us that some of the earliest roots of this season of the Church year are in preparation—preparation for those new to the faith to be baptized as Easter dawns, preparation for those who had to be excommunicated to return to the community of faith, as well as preparation and renewal for the faithful themselves.

I know I have shared this story with several of you already, but I think it speaks powerfully to what we as the Church are seeking to accomplish during this Lenten season. This January,

Susan Duncan and I along with hundreds of other church educators gathered in Denver for the Association of Presbyterian Church Educators Annual Event. There we had the opportunity to hear some impressive speakers, attend inspiring worship, attend interesting workshops, along with some other opportunities. This included "A Taste of Colorado" event where we could encounter local wildlife, experience local culture through storytelling and music, and watch while local artisans created their work. Susan and I spent the majority of our time watching a ceramic artist throwing pots. As her potting wheel turned, she talked about the importance of aligning the clay so that its center of mass was centered on the wheel. She then showed us what it looked like if the clay got out of balance. It wobbled and wiggled more and more as the wheel kept turning. She said something like, "When this happens, you repent and start again." This got me thinking. The root of the Hebrew word "to repent" means "to turn" or "to return". I wonder if we began to think about our repentance, our confession, our returning to God, instead of being merely contrition, as finding those wobbly places in our lives and starting fresh to get ourselves in better balance with our divine potter? This is something that we can (and should) do all the time, but I think this season of Lent can help us to be more mindful of it.

Where are your wobbly places? How can this Lent help you to turn and return to your identity as a beloved child of God? How can this be a time where you are being formed and reformed through scripture, worship, prayer, practice, singing, etc.? Will you ponder these things with me?



Location: The Charles Hendricks Education Building

Organization 1-2-3:

- 1. Books are catalogued using the same Dewey Decimal System found in public and school libraries.
- 2. Most Bibles are not catalogued. Use in the building and return to the shelves on the same day.

A Climate for Change: Global Warming Facts for Faith-Based Decisions, by Katherine Hayhoe and Andrew Farley. 206 p. FaithWords, 2009. WCPC Library call number: **261.88 Hay**

Katherine Hayhoe and Andrew Farley, wife and husband, are professors at Texas Tech University. Hayhoe, a climate scientist, outlines evidence supporting man's influence on climate. Farley, an evangelical pastor and applied linguistics professor, presents Biblical arguments for man's responsibility to ameliorate the effects of climate change.

Hayhoe examines data pointing to the Sun, Earth's natural cycles, and volcanoes as major causes of climate change. She presents a compelling case, demonstrated through climate modeling, to show that increases in greenhouse gases produced by human activities are the primary cause of climate change

(see Figure 12 of the book).

Farley quotes Old Testament scripture saying that God gave man *dominion* over the Earth, meaning humans should respect and take care of God's creation. He infers that *loving thy neighbor as thyself*, from the New Testament, means Christians should work to reduce the effects of climate change, especially rising sea levels that will disastrously impact so many lives.

Hayhoe's scientific discussions are clear and convincing. I find Farley's New Testament interpretation regarding climate change tenuous since Gospel writers and early Christians were mostly concerned for their lives and salvation, not climate change. However, his basic premise that man should take responsibility for those harmed by it is consistent with Christ's message of love. A climate change doubter or someone still trying to weigh the evidence would benefit from reading the book.

The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.


