Life is full of choices. We make them all the time. What will we have for breakfast? Will I get up early and walk or put it off to later or maybe tomorrow? Will I listen to that new novel or actually read it? And if I do read it should I buy a copy or just download it on my Kindle? Should I upgrade my computer? My cell phone?

Most of these choices, while not unimportant, matter mostly to us. They don't really impact other people. But there are some choices that not only impact our lives but also impact the lives of others. We make choices and those choices can bless our lives and other lives, those we know and love, and others we may never meet.

This year our Stewardship Theme is **"Choose Wisely, Live Fully."** I believe The Woodlands Community Presbyterian Church throughout our short history has chosen wisely and as a result not only has this community lived fully but so have others because of the choices we have made.

People are encouraged through worship, or are given new ways to look at the world through study, or to connect to others so they don't feel so alone, or to reach out to those who are most vulnerable.

In other words choices have made this congregation a place where God's Kingdom isn't just discussed and talked about but a place where it can be experienced and seen. Our commitment is to the gospel of Christ and to be witnesses to the good news even if it costs us something. Because it always costs us something. But the cost of doing nothing is even more expensive.

Dear Ones,

A number of years ago, my Grandmother Grice pulled me aside during a family reunion. She wanted to give me something and didn't want the other cousins to feel left out. She had a carefully packed china coffee and tea service for 12. My grandfather had brought it back from Germany for his mother, my great-grandmother. She wanted me to have this beautiful set, because I was a pastor, and I would need to host teas in my home as a part of my work. I didn't have the heart to tell her that I would probably never *need* to host a tea in my home. Neither did I have the heart to tell her that my other cousins would probably not care at all

that I was being gifted this set— that they would not want many of the treasures of a past

In my family, often I find myself in the role of "story keeper" for my generation. This tea service is a part of the story of my great-grandmother who was a pastor's wife and almost certainly hosted countless teas for members of the church in her home. It is also a part of my grandmother's story. The hospitality she experienced and shared as part of the Presbyterian Women's circle to which she belonged for years was an important part of her faith formation and practice. Through two churches, and four moves this beautiful tea set has remained safe in it's protective storage containers in my "china cabinet". Until this summer, I think I had used it once. I was afraid that I would break it- that I would mess it up. I was afraid to make it a part of my story.

Thinking about this has made me wonder what other parts of our lives of faith we keep safely packed away for fear we might break them. Are we "bubble-wrapping" our interpretation of scripture, safe-guarding our favorite hymns, protecting our "traditional" pew in the sanctuary, or even carefully curating the traditions of our church life? How are we teaching ourselves, our neighbors, and the generations that follow that while our faith is a precious and beautiful thing, it is not nearly as fragile as we might fear? The Church, and more importantly our faith in Christ, has survived many, many generations of faithful AND flawed people like you and me. It may have a few chips and other signs of wear, but it has not been shattered yet. But what good is it if we keep it safely packed away on a shelf? At the end of October this year we marked the 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation with Martin Luther's 95 Theses. As Presbyterians we say that we are "the church reformed and always to be reformed according to the Word of God."¹ In the spirit of the Reformation and in the spirit of our calling as the church, perhaps we (including me) need to move out beyond our anxieties, and be willing to take a few risks, try on new ideas and practices, and share our story of faith, so others can come to know it, and love it, and share it as well. After all according to our Book of Order, "The Church is to be a community of faith, entrusting itself to God alone, even at the risk of losing its life."² These are just some of the things I ponder as I enjoy a cup of tea.

Would you like to be a part of the monarch butterfly's magical migration to their winter home in Mexico? WCPC's Creation Care Team is planting the monarch's primary host plant, milkweed, on our church property. You can help this diminishing species too! The milkweed, or asclepias plant, is very easy to sow and grow. They do best in a sunny part of the yard, and are often adorned with yellow and orange blooms. The butterflies will find the plants and lay eggs on the leaves. These leaves provide the nourishment the baby caterpillars need once they hatch from their eggs. If the caterpillars seem to destroy the plant by eating all the leaves, don't worry. It will re-foliate in time.

The Houston area is an important part of the monarch flyway, both in the spring and fall as they travel from Mexico throughout North America and back again. The more milkweed we can provide for them, the more we help save this special butterfly species for future generations. Milkweed seeds are available by contacting CCT member Sa-

rah Ferderer at 936-524-6345.

Nine year-old Milo Cress has alerted us to the damage plastic straws do to our environment. Wow! Smart kid! He loves wildlife and sea life so much that he has started a campaign to reduce their use. Do you always need one? No. But you probably always get one. So this is a shout out to support a "straws upon request only" policy at your favorite restaurant. That will go a long way toward cleaning up our beautiful earth!

I frequently have the opportunity, in my average workday, to tell people that I am a church youth leader. I almost always get the same dumbfounded response question, "WHY?" (Meaning, why on earth would you willingly put yourself through that?) The short answer that is that I, and the rest of my Youth Team cohorts, feel a great sense of "call". That call comes with an equally great sense of responsibility. We all know that teenagers are mercurial. There is no handbook, course, strategy, or anything else that will give you all the answers. The great thing about our youth is that they will cut you plenty of slack if you let them know that you don't have all the answers. We use the Bible and our experiences to try to figure things out together.

This Fall, we are tackling some tough issues together. When you talk about "Everybody's Included", it leads to some discus-sions about who might not feel so included, and why. Sometimes lesson plans get tossed out the window, and lessons don't go quite as we had hoped. Our Youth are no longer children, yet not quite adults. They are exposed to things that we can't totally control. They have lots of questions, and as emerging disciples, they need to be thinking about the answers. Some of them are dealing with some really big issues in their young lives. They want things to be fair, and they want people to listen to them. Of course they would prefer to always just have fun, but who wouldn't? We would be doing them a disservice if we didn't occasionally at least try to go deep on issues fasting cosh of up as christians to be on issues facing each of us as Christians today. We work hard to create an environment in Youth Group where our kids feel safe to ask those hard questions, disagree on the

answers in a civil manner, and still love one another. Just when we think that "the wheels may be falling off the bus", they surprise us

by doing just that! I want those of you who are not involved in Youth Ministry to know just what an amazing group of young people we have in our Congregation. They are funny, kind, talented, thoughtful, quick to forgive, and full of promise. Our Youth leaders are the best people I know, and they really, REALLY, care about each and every young person in the program. I feel lucky to be a part of this program, and a part of this congregation, and I know that God is at work here!
