Growing Native!

The Creation Care Team has been busy transforming our Prayer Garden and other beds into pollinator gardens using native plants. This workshop at Mercer Botanic Center is an opportunity to learn how to help at WCPC and how to transform your own spaces at home. The Mercer Society's **Growing Native** workshop and sale of native plants will be held on **October 7**, 2017 at the Mercer Botanic Garden (link to flyer here: https://goo.gl/6dyJkN) The workshop is from 8:30 to 1:30; the (public) plant sale: 10:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Workshop: Saving the World with Nine Natives: Landscaping for Home and Public Spaces Our planet is entering into a new era known as the Sixth Extinction. Across the globe wildlife populations are declining. This is also happening in Greater Houston. Your yard, church or school garden, or public park can be a place to help save wildlife at this critical time and the good news is you can start small. Katy Prairie Conservancy is working with landscape architects on simple gardening plans, which incorporate nine aesthetically pleasing plants native to our region that can be mixed with non native plants and make a positive impact on wildlife.

Workshop: Knowing and Growing Native Plants

Autumn blooming and fruiting native plants provide numerous landscape uses and ecoservices, like attracting resident and migrating wildlife. Discuss specific landscaping applications using native plants, such as screens and as part of bioswales. Identify local invasive plants and discuss native alternatives to use in landscaping.

Tour: Endangered Species and Native Plant Garden:

The Endangered Species and Native Plant Garden at Mercer Botanic Gardens is not only home to 27 threatened and endangered plant species, but it also serves as an important teaching tool. While touring the garden, identify plant species in the woodland and wetland habitats, and notice how common native plants complement the rare native species. Observe and discuss how local native plants create beautiful gardens that conserve water, are sustainable, and provide food sources and shelter for local wildlife.

Education Displays: Autumn Blooming and Fruiting Local Native Flora
Fresh specimens of distinctive, autumn blooming and fruiting local native flora will be displayed in the workshop classroom. Specimens will be grouped by plant family and identified by scientific name, common name, and family. Descriptions will include annual or perennial classification, habitat, benefit to wildlife, and landscape applications.



I Don't Believe in Climate Change. I Believe in God.

I don't believe in climate change.

I believe in God. I believe He created this amazing planet we live in, and gave us responsibility—or stewardship—or dominion over it. I believe God delights in his creation and wants us to, as well. And I believe we are to love others, especially the poor, the vulnerable, and those most in need, as Christ loved us.




I don't believe in global warming. The evidence of God's creation tells us it's real. Nearly two hundred years of meticulous scientific studies has established that it's not a natural cycle this time: it's us. And my own research demonstrates the severity of the consequences for all of us, particularly those less fortunate than us who are already suffering. We care about a changing climate because it exacerbates the risks we face today: hunger, poverty, disease, and injustice.

Yet when we hear Christians discussing climate change, often the predominant responses are negative: hostility, anger, and denial, a stew of toxic emotions underlain by fear. Fear of losing an identity that's based on politics and ideology, if we get on board with a "liberal" issue; fear of rejection by our family, our community, even our church; or fear of losing our comfortable lifestyle in search of what's right and just.

As Christians, we have a litmus test for these emotions. Because, as the apostle Paul writes to Timothy, "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind." So when we see people responding in fear, we know that's not who we're meant to be.

What gifts does God give us? Power, to affect meaningful, long-term change. Love, to share God's heart for our brothers and sisters who are hurting and in need. And a sound mind: to look at the reality of what is happening in our world and acknowledge that yes, climate change is real, it's serious, and we need to fix it.

Being Christian isn't a hindrance to acting on climate. On the contrary, if we believe we're called "to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with our God," then caring about a changing climate, and those already suffering its impacts, is what we've been created to do. It's who we are.

The Mission Outreach Team's mission statement reads:




With Us At The Gathering Place

The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

Our Medical Student in South Sudan

In January a young Sudanese man returned to his homeland after spending 13 years in a refugee camp in Kenya. His object was to pursue a Diploma in Clinical Medicine and Public Health at the Juba Institute of Health Sciences in South Sudan. That young man, John Deng Mayola, is known to many of our members of WCPC.

Deng is a brother of Abraham Wei, member of WCPC. Beginning in 2004, a number of WCPC members began to provide support for Deng (and another brother Agot), so that they could attend school in Kenya. Both boys graduated from secondary school several years ago. Deng is now pursuing his dream to become a doctor. The current course of study is short of that, but it will allow him to work in the medical field in a country that is sorely lacking in skilled medical care. It is our pleasure to be a part of this!

We just received Deng's grade report from the first term. He achieved a B average in 9 classes, with grades of A (excellent) in Nursing I, First Aid, and Nutrition. This is a particularly remarkable achievement for someone with Deng's educational history! Please keep Deng in your prayers as he enters his second term.

One thing that would be very helpful for Deng would be a smart phone or a computer. By necessity, these would have to be purchased in country. If you are interested in helping to fund this gift or provide for his tuition expenses, please make your check to WCPC and mark it for "Refugee Assistance Fund." We will try to update you on his progress.



2017 Peru Mission Trips



In late July and early August, eight members of WCPC participated in a variety of mission projects across Peru. Our mission teams were blessed by the grace of God through the warmth and friendship exhibited by the Peruvian people and the opportunity to share God's love. Their time in Peru was both spiritually uplifting and humbling.

<u>Sicuani</u>

One team returned to Sicuani, in the Andes Mountains south of Cusco, to visit the **Sicuani Bible Seminary** (Sicuani Biblico Seminario, SEBIS) which has been preparing clergy for the ministry in both Spanish and Quechua (native language of the Incan community) for over 66 years. They currently have 35 students enrolled. This year, the WCPC sponsored scholarships were distributed to 13 different seminarians in their 2nd through 4th year of study. Although many were away from the seminary on their mid-term mission projects, we had the opportunity to visit with nearly a third of them.

Since our visit last year, they completed construction of the new kitchen/dining hall and then added a second floor for the Women's Dormitory. The gift WCPC provided in January from our Capital Fund Campaign tithe to mission was sufficient to cover the materials and supply expenses. This allowed SEBIS to complete construction in early June using local resources and labor, including the students.

The seminary continues to be a growing educational outreach of the Iglesia Evangelica Peruana (IEP – one of the two Presbyterian Church denominations in Peru) for the hundreds of small churches in the Peruvian Andes. Their students are becoming well recognized for the pastoral ministry, translation abilities, and enthusiasm. We also learned that SEBIS will soon be accredited as they become an extension campus for one of the big seminaries in Lima.

The second team went to La Molina with First Presbyterian Church – Kingwood to support a medical clinic in Manchay and several construction projects in San Genaro. This was the first time for FPC-K to provide a **Medical Clinic** in **Manchay** and it was very fulfilling. God's grace and love was evident in the warmth and enthusiasm expressed by the local church volunteer support as well as the smiles and hugs from the patience seen. During the week, four doctors and their associated support staff shared their love of Christ with over 550 patients, over 165 of whom received reading glasses.











The construction crew supported two separate projects in San Genaro. One crew gave the **CEDIN Children's Center** (supported by FPC-K and the Presbyterian Church of the Netherlands) a few new coats of paint. The crew painted all the interior walls of the three story building. The other crew painted and assembled four pre-fab homes in the hillsides of **San Genaro** for families who were selected by the CEDIN Children's Center, based on need.




