Parents, ELP has a healthy Snack Policy. We are doing our best to meet all the needs of children while they are in our care. Nutrition is important in children's development and their health now and in the future.

ELP is working with families to provide more nutritious snacks. We are also working with families who have children with allergies.

On your child's VIP snack day, please send your child's favorite fruit or vegetable and dip. No dessert and cookie type baked goods please. Birthdays will be celebrated in the class with a birthday crown, singing and the child will be made to feel extra special on their extra special day! If you want to send a birthday treat, please bring fruits or vegetables or another nutritious snack. Save birthday treats at home for the birthday party! KEEP IT SIMPLE at school and have fun modeling healthy snacking.

Thank you for working with us and we appreciate your help and cooperation.

Also we ask that alternative snacks for your child not be sent to school. You would be amazed what positive habits can begin when friends are all around eating and enjoying something new or considered "disliked."

Our Snack menu is posted in the hallway each month on the large bulletin board. And don't forget to always eat a healthy, protein rich breakfast before school too!

Is It Really "JUST" Play?

No, it really is a child's work! At ELP we are proud to truly offer a developmentally appropriate curriculum. This means that we are intentional about offering play based activities! To someone casually passing by it may seem like "just play," but it is actually so much more! If you pay attention closely you'll recognize the children learning socially, emotionally, and cognitively. Our classrooms, chapel, motor movement, and playground classrooms all offer very rich activities that foster the growth and development of each child. You may often see several teachers sitting on the floor playing with the children, sitting with them at snack and circle times, or simply dancing and running around on the playground in full dramatic play mode! Please know that we are actually "working" and so are the children! This time is our best time to naturally model deeper thinking, problem solving, and appropriate social responses. During this "play" we not only talk with the children and ask open ended questions to foster language, but we also listen carefully! There is no greater method to asses the children than authentically listening!

So next time you think we are JUST HAVING FUN, do not be fooled by the huge smiles, energy, or the noise! PLAY is a child's work and they are

Vision/Hearing/Speech Screening

Texas Law requires ELP to have vision and hearing screening information on file for all four year old's. These screenings will be offered here at ELP this Fall class hours for all PreK students. Look for a note with details and sign ups in the backpack soon! If you should have any concerns for your three year old, screening will be available as well, just stop by the office for a form. Transition students will not need to rescreen again as a 5 year old. All of the children will be rescreened in Kindergarten.

How Does Your Child See Herself?

Self-concept or self-image is how a child thinks of herself in relation to the people and things in the rest of her world.

What is your child's concept of herself? Is she a very important person in her own eyes? Or does she think she's not too good of a person?

It is important that a child have a genuine feeling that she matters in the world.

Psychologists have developed several ways to measure self-concept. Research about school-aged children shows that a child's self-concept is directly related to later achievement in school.

Children who have a poor self-concept tend to do poorly in school learning tasks. Those who feel good about themselves generally do well in school.

Parents can influence their child's self-concept development. Here are three general principles, which will help your child develop a good self-concept.

- 1. Let your child know that you love her. A child needs to know that she is important to you, that she has your love even when she has engaged in some unlovable activities ("I love you, but I don't like what you have just done")
- 2. Help your child handle her failures. What messages are you giving her when she fails? She needs to know that you're on her side, that you accept her win or lose for who she is. Your corrections should deal with what she's done, not what she "is".
- 3. Don't be dishonest. Your child knows when she hasn't done well, when she has failed. If you acknowledge that you know this but that it isn't the end of the world, your child gains confidence in you to reflect an honest value to her.

As a child grows, she tries to find her place in the world. She experiments with different ideas and concepts, looking to you from time to time for guidance and support.

Make sure you give her the room she needs to learn and make mistakes. But also make sure she knows you're on her side – win or lose.

Help to develop a positive self-concept is one of the most important things any parent can do for a child.

Releasing Your Child to Another Person at ELP...

When another person is picking up your child other than your usual parent or carpool, please notify the office and the teacher by letter or phone call. Include: the person's name and relationship to the child.

Note: If an emergency has occurred during school hours - your child can only be released to a person on your emergency contact list. I.D.s will be checked of any new or unknown persons picking up your child. Please be assured that if you are stranded or an emergency has taken place while your child is at school we will take care of him/her until you can reach us. We are aware that these procedures require a little more paperwork and time on your part but it is for the safety of your child, which is first and foremost in our mind. Thank You.

Letting Children Choose

Have you ever thought why do we as adults pursue hobbies such as golf, crochet, or gardening? We spend time in such an activity because we find it enjoyable, we have some control over the activity, and we see it as offering some probability of success. We choose what we will sew, plant or paint; we decide where, when, and with whom we will play golf or tennis.

Children, too, learn best when they have some control over their learning, when activities are meaningful and relevant, and when they can make choices in the materials they will work with and how they will use them.

Children thrive when they have opportunities every day to make choices in their learning. We facilitate children's choices within a carefully —planned environment. We create the environment to allow each child to choose activities that are developmentally appropriate for his or her age. The children choose the peers with whom they will work and play and usually determine how they will use the available materials.

These choices empower children to take control of their own learning. Children use materials and equipment in far more creative and innovative ways than we could ever plan, and they use the materials in ways that meet their own developmental needs.

Research indicates that intrinsic motivation — when we work on a task primarily because we find it satisfying — is the most effective and engaging way to learn. In this program we make an effort to provide materials and activities that provide choice and interest for the children. That's a key reason that you'll see busy, involved children when you visit the classroom.
