GIFTS OF LOVE

2019 Stewardship Focus The Session has established an asking budget of: \$1,180,000.00 for 2019 An 8% increase over this year's Budget.

This increased budget will allow WCPC to:

Increase benevolences (gifts to others outside of WCPC) to 11%. If asking budget is met and exceeded additional funds will go to benevolences until it reaches 12% of approved budget for 2019.

Provide your staff with a 5% salary increase.

Provide more funds to **Building and Grounds** to ensure that we maintain and continue to improve our facilities and campus including safety and security improvements.

Provide our **Evangelism Team** with funds to use in local advertising of special WCPC events and special seasons.

Provide our **Fellowship Team** with additional funding to support The Welcome Center, Wednesday Night Dinners, and other special fellowship events like the Christmas Dinner. All of these events are growing in attendance.

Provide more funding for the **staffing of our nurseries.** We have more families coming on Sundays and need more trained, caring adults in the three nursery rooms in the HEB. In addition to childcare offered for church-wide events, WCPC is also host to a new group for moms of preschoolers from ELP and we are offering child care for this activity. The Children and Tween Team is also looking to expand their budget so we can reach out to more children and families in our immediate community.

Provide the **Worship Team** with funds to hire instrumental ensembles to play on additional Sundays and special occasions, purchase new choir anthems, and purchase new orchestral, solo, and children's scores. New music and maintenance is needed for our handbell choir.

Provide additional funding for our **Youth Team** as they minister to a growing fellowship of teens.

Provide additional funding that will allow the **Creation Care Team** to expand its work from the Prayer Garden to pollinator gardens using native plants, to continue the use of yard and garden products that are environmentally friendly and to continue environmental education and recycling pick-up.

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND





STATEMENT BY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (U.S.A.) STATED CLERK The Reverend Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, II

October 17, 2018

Siblings in Christ,

The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; for God has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers.—Psalm 24: 1-2

According to a new report from the United Nations' International Panel on Climate Change, God's earth could be facing dire consequences sooner than we thought. This panel of 91 scientists from 40 countries has concluded that if greenhouse gas emissions continue at the current rate, our atmosphere will warm by as much as 2.7 degrees Fahrenheit above preindustrial levels by 2040.

The results, according to the panel, would intensify the drought and poverty we are facing now. There would be food shortages, wildfires, and coral reefs would die-off at an alarming rate.

The 223rd General Assembly (2018) affirmed yet again how passionate Presbyterians are about caring for God's creation, particularly about responding with faithful action in a time of climate change.

A policy called "The Earth Is the Lord's" encourages "the whole church to raise a prophetic voice regarding the urgency of healing the climate of the earth, our home and God's gift for the future of all life, human and nonhuman" as pastors take on the moral mantle of preaching and teaching while congregations and Presbyterians lead by our example of making energy choices with integrity (https://www.pc-biz.org/#/search/3000298).

Another policy that was approved by the assembly encouraged the church to "express its profound concern about the destructive effects of climate change on all God's creation, including a disproportionate impact on those living in poverty and in the least developed countries" while advocating for the creation of carbon pricing that is fair and just especially for those in vulnerable populations (https://www.pc-biz.org/#/search/3000325).

The assembly, after much debate and consideration of divestment from fossil fuels, voted to maintain the current corporate engagement strategy of Mission Responsibility for Investment to continue engaging fossil fuel companies of which the PC(USA) holds shares on issues of climate change and environmental sustainability, while vetting those companies for selective divestment at the 224th General Assembly (2020) (https://www.pcbiz.org/#/search/3000263).

These, and the decades of General Assembly policies and Presbyterian action on climate, are especially crucial now.

Presbyterians believe that all people are beloved by God and deserving of a healthy, bright future. We want for our children to breathe clean air and drink clean water. We do not desire for lives and churches to be consistently disrupted by natural disasters caused by climate change. What Presbyterians in North Carolina, Puerto Rico, Florida, Texas, California, New Jersey, and Louisiana have experienced are helping us to realize that the time is now for bold action, and that we can all take steps in the right direction—becoming energy efficient, purchasing renewable energy, lowering our carbon footprint, and advocating for safe environmental policies at all levels of government.

UN Commission on the Status of Women by Kristen Campbell

Last March, I joined with 18 other women (see picture above) to form the PC(USA) delegation to the United Nations' 62nd Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) at the UN Headquarters in New York City. The purpose of the CSW is to set global standards for gender equality and the empowerment of women. The priority theme for the 62nd CSW was "Challenges and opportunities in achieving gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls."

The PC(USA) holds special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council of the UN, and therefore is allowed to bring a delegation to the CSW. Presbyterian delegates met with representatives of UN member states to advocate our position on several topics. We joined together with the delegation from Ecumenical Women at the UN to advocate on Climate Change, Farming and Food Sovereignty, Access to Education, Transportation and Access to Resources, Access to Medical Care, Reproductive Health and Rights, and Women's Empowerment in Governance and Structures. We also attended events at the United Nations and other venues, participated in and attended worship services, and networked with over 4300 other women from around the world.

There were nearly 800 events associated with the CSW. I attended events on women in politics, ending violence against women, the status of women with disabilities, the #MeToo movement and the media, and many events on education. The PC(USA) sponsored an event featuring Presbyterian pastor and co-chair of the Poor People's Campaign, Dr. Liz Theoharis. Delegates to the CSW also were able to attend a Town Hall with UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres.

I will be presenting on my experiences at the CSW on Sunday November 4 during the Sunday School hour. If you cannot make it or just want to know more, please don't hesitate to ask me. I love to talk about

The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you.
