
Please join us throughout Holy Week in the covered walkway for self-guided prayer stations with scripture readings, prayers, and contemplative activities.

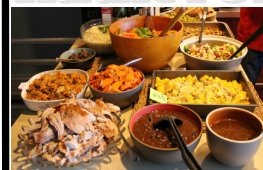
