SABBATICAL PROPOSAL FOR DAVID FOX JONES

June 1 - August 31, 2018

Rest and Prayer: The sabbatical I am imagining will begin with a dedicated time to disengage from the 24/7 nature of pastoral ministry in order to regain balance in my life - physically, emotionally and spiritually. I turn 60 this year. I'm in my 34th year of ministry and when my sabbatical begins (early June '18) I will have been the pastor of WCPC for thirteen years. It is my desire and prayer to retire as the pastor of WCPC. I want to end my ministry here well and believe my sabbatical will give me the opportunity to reflect on my ministry up to this point and look with renew energy to what lies ahead.

Study: Another aspect of the sabbatical I plan is time for study and reflection. First I intend to visit with pastors who are either retired or nearing retirement. I want to listen to either how they ended their ministries or how they are preparing to end them. Learning from them and also hopefully sharing some of what I have discovered from listening to others. Second I will invest at least ten days near Ghost Ranch, a Presbyterian Conference Center in New Mexico. First in a Bed and Breakfast near Ghost (their summer schedule won't allow me to stay at Ghost Ranch but the staff there has invited me to visit the Ranch, eat meals, etc.). Then I plan on a four day, three night visit at the Monastery of Christ in the Desert which is also near Ghost Ranch. I also plan in late July or early August to go to the Iona Community in Scotland and stay there for a week of mediation/study/prayer.

Travel: Lastly I will use some of the sabbatical time to do some traveling. I will be driving to New Mexico, then to Laguna Beach, CA. Jullie will be flying into Laguna and then we plan on visiting her mother, brother, and other friends, and then drive up the coast to San Francisco where Jullie will depart for home. I will continue my drive, returning in a week to ten days to The Woodlands. Along my route, both going and coming, I hope to visit with friends, as well as have conversations with pastors who, as mentioned before, are either retired or nearing retirement. Jullie will be joining me in Scotland and together we will travel Scotland for a week to ten days, ending our time in London.
