Last year over 130 people helped in some way and we expect to need at least that many this year! We need dinner/evening hosts, overnight hosts, Saturday hosts, laundry angels and drivers. Let me share with you our summer schedule which has been approved by your Session:

June - July

Sunday School 9:45 am Worship 11:00 am

August through Labor Day (September 2nd)

No Sunday School

Worship 10:00 am

The purpose of the one joint service during the summer has always been (8 years now) to give members/friends/guests who separately attend the 8:30 service or the 11:00 service 9 months of the year an opportunity to worship together. And when you also consider that there is much traveling and vacationing taking place in the summer one service works well.

The reason the hour of the one worship service in June and July is 11:00 am is due to the value that we place, not only as a congregation, but as Presbyterians, on education. Having an 11:00 am worship service doesn't require changing the time for Sunday School. We have found over the last two summers when we used this same schedule that attendance has been more consistent than when we changed the time of the Sunday School hour as we had to do when a different time other than 11:00 am was chosen.

We traditionally have not held Sunday School August through Labor Day, giving teachers a chance to rest but also prepare for September. So, the Session decided that adjusting the worship time for August to 10:00 am was appropriate.

The only concern about this change is that in the past, since so many, especially those who are unchurched, assume worship at churches is always 11:00 am, we have missed out on guests who arrived in past summers either after the service was over or in the middle. Since we are now using many different online tools and social media to help make others aware of our service times we are praying this problem will not occur in August.

As we have done each year we will evaluate our expectations vs. reality. Certainly, your Session and Worship Team welcome your feedback.

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those in need who make requests to the pastors of WCPC. 



Mission Outreach Team (MOT)


The Mission Outreach Team's mission statement reads:



The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. Who are All Those People Going into the Hendricks Building on Tuesday and Thursday mornings?

"One of them says a blessing over me after each class in a language I don't know. At least I hope it's a blessing...

Another one brings me warm arepas. One makes me laugh every day. One shy one came in with a mysterious black eye. One remembers everything she hears. One has trouble remembering. One is a landscaper. One is a grandma. One tried to tell me a story that I didn't understand, so he just surprised me by suddenly showing me a huge scar across his belly and saying, "Cancer! Bad! Good now!" That told the story pretty well! One walks to class when her blood pressure allows because she doesn't have any other option, and she wants to learn enough English to become a citizen. I love all of them."

These folks are moms and dads and singles and grandparents from China and Honduras and Uzbekistan and Mexico and The Netherlands and Venezuela and Sweden and Peru and Ukraine and El Salvador...and all over the world.

They want to learn English, so under the auspices of Interfaith, volunteer teachers and assistants test them to assess their English proficiency. Interfaith recruits volunteer teachers and helpers, assigns as many students as possible to these adult ESL classes, and the learning begins. Students don't pay anything, but they do buy a \$20.00 textbook, often in installment payments.

What does our church have to do with this? We offer space, often some volunteers, a children's program, and a welcome. WCPC has been an encouraging partner to adult ESL learners, and our buildings have hosted classes for many years.

What is it like to volunteer with these adults? It is rewarding. The volunteer team is committed and collegial, compassionate and fun loving. The students are committed and collegial, too! As teachers, we foster a sense of family, and the students love and appreciate with their whole hearts. They give us their trust, thanks, and occasionally, amazing food from their kitchens. They strive hard to learn, so we are dedicated to teaching. We make mistakes, but we support each other.

Some of the teachers and helpers are teachers by trade, but some are not. They have a sense that they could teach, given some support and materials and a partner. Some are bilingual, but some are not. All of them care about immigrants and believe that speaking English is empowering. All sense that they gain more than they give. 


