PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those in need who make requests to the pastors of WCPC. Primarily it is used to assist non-members, but on occasion funds are used to assist members with short-term needs. Individuals and families in the past have been helped with rent, utilities, car repair, and prescriptions. A person requesting aid meets with one of our pastors. Their needs are assessed and typically referrals are provided. As an example, if someone lives in the area supported by Interfaith of The Woodlands they are encouraged to contact Interfaith. Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a special contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. Please make certain that your check to WCPC notes that it is for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. If you would like more information, please don't hesitate to contact any of our pastors.



Did you know that my mantis friends and I are carnivores? We eat spiders, frogs, lizards, and even small birds. You humans, on the other hand, are omnivores, so you have more choices in what you eat. Did you know that cutting down on beef is a great way to help the environment? Beef production takes a HUGE toll on our planet. So when you choose what to eat, your wise choice can really make a difference!

WHAT'S FOR DINNER? – WE HAVE CHOICES

Omnivore: an animal that eats food from both plants and animals. As omnivores, humans have choices when it comes to our diet. That gives us an opportunity to look closely about what we eat.

A recent study published in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences* looked at livestock-based food production as "an important and pervasive way humans impact the environment." In particular, the production of beef is significantly more harmful than that of dairy, poultry, pork and eggs.



Researchers are developing new ways to quantify the effects of livestock production. Livestock operations are inefficient converters of crop calories into food, and they produce about 20% of global greenhouse gas emissions. These production centers are known polluters of land, air and water. This knowledge helps with the development of better ways to produce food.

But it is beef production that surpasses all. Beef operations require 28 times more land, 11 times more water, and result in 5 times more greenhouse gas emissions than poultry or pork. Beef requires 160 times more land and produces 11 times more greenhouse gas emissions than wheat and rice.

These are things to consider as we make our food choices on a daily basis. Cutting back on beef is an easy way to make a positive impact on both our health and our environment.

The Mission Outreach Team's mission statement reads:

Because God's love knows no bounds, the Mission Outreach Team encourages the congregation of WCPC to be a servant people, witnessing to the light of Christ through actions and words so that the world might know the grace, peace, and love of God.

Each one of us has unique gifts and can make a contribution for the glory of God. The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from InterFaith CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. Love Fosters Hope Emergency Home

Sarah*, 18, desperately wanted to graduate from high school but life events were not working in her favor. In the middle of the year, her foster mom moved out of state. Being 18, Sarah was technically "out of the system". What to do? She decided to give her biological mom a try. That did not work long with her bio mom stealing money from her for the mom's drug habit. Next Sarah moved into her boyfriend's family home. That home proved to be chaotic. And all the while Sarah was trying to continue high school. That's when Love Fosters Hope stepped in.

Love Fosters Hope has opened an emergency home for aged out foster teens. Sarah was welcomed in and arrangements were made for her to finish high school and then plans will be put together to help her enroll in cosmetology school and find a place to live after graduation.

Aged out foster youth many times end up homeless when they have no place to live and no guidance for how to take the next step. Love Fosters Hope provides a safe, loving home staffed by a trained house couple. Aged out youth are welcome to live there temporarily while a permanent living situation is found and plans for the future are developed. A safe place to live can mean the difference between homelessness and a productive, fulfilling life.


