PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a special contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. 

The following description of overtures approved by the 2018 General Assembly (GA) concerns an overture forwarded by WCPC's Session to New Covenant Presbytery which approved and forwarded it to the GA, as well as a similar overture. The condensed article, originally published on PC (USA)'s Presbyterian Mission's Eco-Justice Blog, contains links to both overtures.

G.A. and Carbon Pricing, 101

By Bill Bray, Ron Spross, and Tomie Evans, Ruling Elders, Rev Bob Taylor, Teaching Elder (retired)—overtures advocates to the 2018 General Assembly that passed the overtures.

The General Assembly is inviting us to a call to action. A prayer-full calling for us to build bridges of trust with our neighbors and Congress (yes, Congress!), supporting actions on climate.

The full Plenary of the General Assembly voted to approve the New Covenant 08-12[https://www.pc-biz.org/#/search/3000325] overture and approved the Twin Cities 08-09 [www.pc-biz.org/#/search/3000320] overture.

The GA approval affirms and invites us to learn about the carbon dividend idea. They also direct the Presbytery Mission Agency and local congregations to support actions on advocacy with Congress, for the Carbon Dividend idea, and to build partnerships with organizations such as Citizens' Climate Lobby.

We need lower-carbon choices. All business, not just energy utilities, needs to shift. Since it's a core business behavior to avoid costs, by adding a fee to fossil fuels at the wellhead, mine, and border, businesses will pick suppliers avoiding the cost, become more efficient, and *constantly* innovate to offer lower-carbon lower-cost products, energy, food, and transportation.

Setting a fee at the source by Congress assures it's universally applied to business and consumers (businesses can't trade for an exception), making it fair and effective.

By returning all of the fee each month to every family across the entire USA as a dividend, it is also socially just, possibly the only proposal that immediately helps families and communities.

More jobs. Better climate. Safer, healthier families. By investing our relentless well-organized time to build relationships and support Congress, we become a force *for* Nature.

The remaining 25% will be retained by our congregation and will be used to support Hand in Hand, which is the only network of Jewish-Arab schools in Israel (see article below for more information).

Hand in Hand: Center for Jewish-Arab Education in Israel, is building peace, partner-ship and equality through a network of integrated, bilingual schools. Hand in Hand in Jerusalem is a school where Jews and Arabs study together. It started in 1998 as one kindergarten class in Jerusalem and one first grade class in Galilee and has grown to be a national movement, encompassing six schools and close to 1,800 students. Beyond the classroom, Hand in Hand engages thousands of Jewish and Arab adults in joint community programs. Their goals are to open more integrated Jewish-Arab schools,

spread their model of multicultural, bilingual education to more communities in Israel and to be a strong and viable model for Jewish-Arab shared society. Hand in Hand is transforming fear and mistrust into friendship and cooperation, proving to all of Israeli society that Arabs and Jews can live together.

The Gathering Place

The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. help native tribes win collective land rights to prevent major companies from evicting them from their territories. 2. They teach sign language to deaf-mute children and their parents in the area. 3. They help empower a network of high school students to prevent sex trafficking. He worked on all three of these projects in different capacities (chronicling the natives ongoing legal battles, learning sign language, and photographing high school seminars.) Peru Update



2018 Peru Mission Trip to Quillabamba

In May, 27 people from Bryan Presbyterian Church, The Texas A & M Health Science Center, Blinn College, and WCPC headed to Quillabamba, Peru. The mission team included: 1 doctor; 3 nurses; 4 nursing students; a pharmacist; and 6 PT students and a PT doctor. After a tiring journey from Houston to Lima to Cusco, the team boarded a bus for a 6 - hour ride up and over the Andes to Quillabamba, an area considered low jungle (only 3000 feet high). The work site was the Bible Institute that Bryan Presbyterian had built over the last couple of years, with a financial donation from WCPC to complete the kitchen. The site, perched on top of a hillside overlooking the Urubamba river, consists of a large open room, a two-story dormitory (6 rooms), two more large rooms and a kitchen/dining room. It is a 45- minute bus ride from Quillabamba, where good medical and dental care is available but which is not readily accessible to the families living in the mountains.

This was the first time that the Bryan team offered a medical mission along with crafts for the children whose parents were waiting to see a doctor. The health needs were characteristic of people spending their lifetime in poverty and physical labor (physical therapy was much needed). Other common ailments included parasites, vitamin deficiency, respiratory problems, diabetes and foot infections; several had cancerous growths. Churches in the Presbytery had been given half day "slots" so each day, small busloads of patients from the churches arrived along with many others who walked from neighboring areas. Over 3.5 days, 378 patients were served. There were so many patients that every day 30 or more were turned away. Many spent the night sleeping on the ground, hoping to be seen the next day. Getting to the site was grueling. One woman had walked 9 hours and trips of 3 hours were common but the chance to see an American doctor was a gift to them.

What most startled me was the extreme lack of dental hygiene among the children. Almost all had rotten teeth, even those who were 4 and 5 years old. Many of the adults had lost most of their teeth.

On the ride back to Cusco, the bus was stopped by a police blockade. Northern Peru has surpassed Columbia in the drug trade and check points are common. The bus was allowed to continue after a few minutes. The mission team flew from Cusco to Lima to Houston, tired but happy that God's love was shared with the wonderful people that were served.

2018 Peru Mission Trip to Quillabamba

This summer, 8 members from WCPC joined First Presbyterian Church – Kingwood on a mission trip to the Manchay barrio in the La Molina District of Peru (Lima area). The mission projects included a medical clinic and vacation bible school. This was the second year for a medical clinic at the local church and the first year for vacation bible school. The congregation had obviously grown over the past year as evidenced by the increase in the number of local church volunteers (nearly doubled) and the addition of a second floor to the building. The significant increase in space allowed for the simultaneous operation of both the medical clinic and vacation bible school at the same location.

The medical team conducted 551 physical examinations and over 300 eye examinations. In partnership with a local optometrist, 210 prescriptions eye glasses were made (from the prescription and reading glasses we donated) and subsequently distributed by the local church. In addition, 43 reading glasses were distributed in the clinic.

Vacation bible school was offered in two separate sessions each day (morning & afternoon) and included bible lessons, related crafts, and songs and games. The mission teams were supported by nearly a dozen volunteers from the local church. The total attendance for the week exceeded 550.

Learning More About Our Seminarian, Naomi



Our Seminarian Naomi Daka

Recently, Dustin Ellington, a PCUSA co-worker in Lusaka, Zambia who helps train pastors in the basic Bachelor of Theology program and also has responsibility for teaching in the Master's in Theology program at Justo Mwale University, sat down with three of his students and asked big questions of each. In his June, 2018 Mission Partnership Update for The Outreach Foundation, Dustin shared the answers given by his students in hopes that their words might touch our hearts and give us insight into the church in their part of the world. Naomi Daka, the seminary student WCPC supports at Justo Mwale, was one of these three students. Below are the questions asked of and the responses given by Naomi.

1. When you think of your church in your home country, what encourages you and leads you to thank God?

Naomi Daka (second-year student from Zambia): The zeal that people have to worship God really makes me thank God. People have zeal for Sundays. There are a variety of motives, but it's still encouraging to see. People really want to be part of church. Something additional is the inclusiveness ... [towards] female ministers; this really makes me thank God for my church. And the encouragement we ministers get from the church to further our studies also encourages me.

2. What concerns you when you look at the church in your home country, so Christians in America can join your concern and pray for believers there?

Naomi: I spoke earlier of zeal but varying motives. It's also my concern, and I pray I don't fall into it, that the ministers often want to go to urban congregations [where the pay is better]. Yet the people in the rural areas need to hear the word of God. Pray that we ministers can hear the voice of God, and that God will provide for those who minister in rural areas. We can also pray that ministers will remember their first call, when they said they would go anywhere.

3. Are there ways your education at Justo Mwale University is giving you hope by equipping you to face these challenges and concerns? How so?

Naomi: JMU is equipping me with an openness to learn. I'm learning about contextualizing the word and becoming a listening minister. My education here has also taught me humility. Being humble is more important than the grades I receive.





All Ears! Listening & Language Center is blessed to be adopted as a mission of The Woodlands Community Presbyterian Church. All Ears! is a non-profit dedicated to empowering children who are deaf and hard of hearing and their families to develop listening and spoken language. In other words, we teach deaf children how to talk with the goal of mainstream school by kindergarten. When these children are mainstreamed by kindergarten without special services, it saves the tax payers over \$400,000 per child.

3 of every 1,000 babies are born with hearing loss.

95% of these babies are born to families who listen and speak who want their children to communicate using the same language that they do. With the assistance of hearing aids and/or

cochlear implants, children who are deaf can learn to listen and speak.

There are several aspects of the family focused All Ears! Center that make it unique. We provide Auditory Verbal Therapy sessions for families. These sessions focus on the development of listening, language and speech skills for children with hearing loss by guiding and coaching the *parents*. Family Nights consisting of parent support, education and camaraderie are provided free for anyone in the community.

The critical time period for developing the listening part of the brain is birth to three years of age. Parents at All Ears! Center may receive services as soon as their child fails a newborn hearing screening. Those services range from community resources, Auditory Verbal Therapy, Infant-Toddler Play Group, Family Night, mentoring, preschool classes with hearing peers and summer camp.

90% of what kids learn by kindergarten they learn by overhearing. Therefore it is important for children learning how to listen and speak to have good language role models. The Early Learning Program, another Woodlands Community Presbyterian Church mission, is a state licensed preschool. The Early Learning Program and All Ears! work closely together to ensure excellent speech, language and social skills are overheard and observed by All Ears! students. All Ears! Center staff work on specific speech, listening and language skills. Then the students have an opportunity to practice and perfect those skills with age appropriate hearing peers from The Early Learning Program.

All Ears! Center was established in 2014 with 5 students. Currently 22 children are receiving direct services. Countless families are taking advantage of Family Night services. Hearing aid and cochlear implant manufacturers are providing educational opportunities to the community through All Ears! Center at The Woodlands Community Presbyterian Church. All Ears! is also working collaboratively with Texas Children's Hospital The Woodlands to ensure the needs of the community are met.

The mission of All Ears! is to empower families of children who are deaf and hard of hearing, without financial burden, who have chosen listening and spoken language as their child's communication option by teaching them listening, speaking and literacy skills in order to promote independence.


