Gradual Entry

Car-line news

The car line will begin on Monday, September 10. The car-line dropoff will be under the Porte-cache, outside of the sanctuary and the parking lot by the education building will be designated for walk-ins.

Please remember...

- Drive slowly through the parking lot at all times to ensure safety.
- Use your carline file folders in your front windshield. You received this folder at your visitation, it has your child's name written on it already. Simply place this folder on the side of the car that your child is on and teachers will be able to bring your child to you more quickly and keep the line moving.
- Stay in your vehicle. Staff is required to buckle your child into their car seats. For safety, your child's car seat should be in the back seat
- No cell phones at all while in car line, please.

The left lane is designated for PM students to be dropped off at Noon.

Please be patient with a slow moving car line, making sure every child is properly secured in a car seat just takes time. Remember you always have the option to walk your child in or pick her/him up at the classroom door.

Please remember that September tuition is due the first week of school. Tuition is due the first week of each month after the first week there is a \$10 late fee that will incur after the first week. Please place your tuition in our ELP mailbox in the school hallway, or it may be pinned to the outside of your child's backpack or handed to a car line teacher.

Helpful Hints

Comfortable clothing—Parents – please send your child to school in comfortable "play" clothes and closed toe shoes. We are very active and creative at school and clothing will likely get dirty. We want your child to feel at ease and free to explore and play with others. (It's not too late to request an ELP t shirt for your child if you did not receive one at visitations)

Label everything—Please be sure to LABEL EVERYTHING – backpack, lunch box, clothes, blanket, etc., with your child's name. This will help our day run more smoothly and will ensure that the proper items are returned to home. (Please use your new ELP tags you received.)

Change of clothing—Please send a complete change of clothes with your child everyday. (shoes, socks and underwear too). Everyone has an occasional accident or a paint spill sometimes, and we offer wet sensory play daily. Your child will feel much more comfortable if he/she has can play freely and change if needed.

HIDE IT IN YOUR HEART

"When God formed my heart, He added a pocket A place for His word See? I can zip it and lock it.

It's written in Psalms 119, verse 11.

I'm to hold God's word tight until the day I'm in heaven."

I have hidden Your word in my heart so that I might not sin against You.' Psalms 119:11. When King David wrote this psalm, he wasn't saying he was hiding God's word to keep it secret. What he meant was that as he studied scripture, the words were absorbed into his soul and became part of who he was. As he committed verses to memory, they became a natural part of his thoughts. David knew the secret to 'walking the walk' was that if God's teachings were in his heart and in his head, then no matter where he was or what his circumstances, he would be armed with God's wisdom.

This is one of the reasons why ELP has school-wide, monthly Bible memory verses for the children to learn. The one that we begin with each September is "I am wonder-fully made" Psalms 139:14. Every chapel after practicing the verse several times, we all say it once more into our hands and then place the words in our 'heart pockets' so that we can always carry God's word with us just like King David.

Moms and Dads, you have to know that my own heart is filled with joy as I watch your children grow in God's word throughout the year. When I see the excited anticipation in these in impressionable faces as they walk in to chapel each week, my life just doesn't get any more rewarding than this. They get it...the children truly get it! THIS is what the bible was talking about when it says in 2 John 1:4, "It has given me great joy to find some of your children walking in the truth, just as the Father commanded us." September through May, we'll be exploring the Old Testament through the New Testament, Jesus's birth through His Resurrection, and the planting seeds of our Father's truth through the ripening of the fruit of the Spirit.

It's going to be a year of growing...physically, emotionally, and spiritually for your child and I am delighted to be a part of it.

What is "Developmentally Appropriate Practice?"

You probably have noticed that our classroom has a lot of bustle and noise, that children are up doing things, talking, playing and exploring. Such a classroom environment differs from the old grade-school images of a teacher doing a lot of talking at a blackboard while children sit and listen quietly at their desks.

Research and experience tell us that to be effective with young children, teaching practices need to be "developmentally appropriate." What this means is simply that educators need to think first about what young children are like and then create an environment and experiences that are in tune with children's characteristics.

Early childhood, after all, is a time of life quite different from adulthood, and even from the later school years. Children 3-6 learn far better through direct interactive experiences than through just listening to someone talk. They learn extraordinary amounts through play and exploration. And the younger children are, the more what they learn needs to be relevant and interesting on the day they learn it, not just in the context of some future learning.

Based on such knowledge about what children of this age are like, we design our program to fit them. It works a lot better than trying to redesign children!

A developmentally appropriate program like ours is age appropriate. But that's not all. To make the program a good place for every child, we gear our classroom environment and activities to this community and the families involved. We're eager to learn as much as we can about each child's family, cultural background, past experience, and current circumstances. With this knowledge we work to create a program that fits the children and the families we serve.

Promoting Independence With Three's and Four's

"Expect it" – confused as to why he will do it for the teacher and not at home? This is typical, but have you ever wondered why? It might just be because......

At school we allow and sometimes expect children to do for themselves (or at least try it first). It is natural for us all to try to live up to other's expectations and this applies to children as well. Having the simple "try, you can do it" spirit and accepting accidents and failed attempts, builds confidence! Preschoolers definitely need a lot of parental help, but preschool aged children are typically able to do more for themselves than we give them credit for (or give them time to try).

Next time your child needs a snack opened, needs to get dressed, or makes a spill that needs cleaning up, try confidently "expecting" that this is something that he can do for himself! Sure, there are times when we are rushed and can't allow for these practice attempts, but remember to intentionally "promote independence" and let him try it on his own!
