Dear WCPC family:

More than a few have asked me why don't we sing Christmas carols until after Christmas? Why do we celebrate Advent? In Feasting On the Word, a commentary on the lectionary, I found this quote helpful.

"Probably the reason I love Advent so much is that it is a reflection of how I feel most of the time. I might not feel sorry during Lent, when the liturgical calendar begs repentance. I might not feel victorious, even though it is Easter morning. I might not feel full of the Spirit, even though it is Pentecost and the liturgy spins out fiery gusts of ecstasy. But during Advent, I am always in sync with the season. Advent unfailingly embraces and com-

Pastor prehends my reality. And what is that? I think of the Spanish word anhelo, or longing. Ad-

vent is when the church can no longer contain its unfulfilled desire and the cry of anhelo bursts forth: Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus! O Come, O Come, Emanuel!" (Heidi Neumark, a Lutheran pastor serving in the Bronx) Maybe in your life you are waiting or longing. Waiting for something, maybe anything that will make

your life better. Or waiting for a doctor's report. Waiting for a new job. Waiting for the restoration of a relationship. Waiting to die.

And there are those waiting for justice. Or waiting for guns to be silenced, waiting for peace. Some are waiting, literally, for food or medical care, for medicine.

But waiting doesn't mean God isn't at work. In fact, just the opposite. Often, it's while we are waiting that God is most at work giving us hope! A hope that causes us to trust and to act faithfully and obediently as followers of the Christ child. Bringing hope to others and in the process experiencing it ourselves.

So, the hymns we sing and the Scriptures we read during Advent reflect this longing, this hope that in the Christ Child God has started something.

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

"It's the most wonderful time of the year." At least, that is what holiday crooners would have us believe. For many though, these last weeks of the year can be some of the most difficult. For some, the celebrations of Thanksgiving, Christmas, etc. without a loved one heighten their grief. Others find themselves far away from family and friends and unable to join with them for celebrations. Or perhaps, visiting family cause tensions to elevate in relationships and homes. Some may find the "rush, rush, rush" of holiday busy-ness and society's expectations to be overwhelming. The holidays can also heighten the stresses of lost jobs, divorces, empty nests, etc. And if that weren't enough, the shorter days and gloomier weather can also make it harder to find oneself in a "holiday mood." With com-

mercial messaging, and others in high spirits, it can be very difficult to admit to ourselves that there is just not as much joy this year in this season where "Joy" is on display surrounded by twinkling lights.

While the music and liturgy we use during the season of Advent may not "get us into the Christmas spirit," it is a season of waiting, a season of longing for the peace, justice, and wholeness that come with our longexpected savior. You may have heard services like this called "Longest Night," or "Blue Christmas." We will gather for prayer, scripture, and liturgy that speaks to our longing for light in a season that can sometimes feel quite dark. If you find yourself in need of a little extra hope this season, I do hope you will join us for this service, **December 19 at 5:00 pm**.

The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. Christmas Offering 2018

The Christmas Offering is a combination of the Christmas Joy and Christmas Eve offerings. That is, twentyfive percent of the Christmas Offering will go to the PC(USA) Special Christmas Joy Offering, which is split evenly between the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and scholarship funds for Presbyterianrelated racial ethnic schools and colleges. The remaining seventy-five percent will go to help establish a Kids' Meals Route in Montgomery County.

Kids' Meals Route in Montgomery County

Preschool-aged children often fall through the gap of social services addressing food insecurity. Kids' Meals addresses the hunger and food insecurity for the age 5 and younger population who cannot access school free meal programs. Each weekday, Kids' Meals delivers approximately 2,900 heathy meals to Houston's hungriest preschool-aged children. When school is out, every child up to age 18 in these homes also receives a healthy meal, which means Kids' Meals delivers meals to roughly 4,800 kids per day. Kids' Meals is basically Meals on Wheels for preschool-aged children.

Currently there is no Kids' Meals route in Montgomery County. The goal is start a route which will deliver meals to 200 preschoolers in our county beginning next year. The plan is then to add at least 200 preschoolers every quarter during 2019. The Kids' Meals organization has been raising funds to start the Montgomery County Route, but needs \$14,000 more to just get the program off the ground. So, the Mission Outreach Team voted at their November meeting to have the local portion of the Christmas Offering go to help get the Kids' Meals route in Montgomery County up and running in 2019.

The youth and other groups at WCPC currently assemble shelf-stable lunches for Kids' Meals that are delivered to preschoolers in the Houston area. Once the Montgomery County Route is established, WCPC hopes also to make sandwiches for those lunches delivered on the same or next day in our area.

Please give generously to the Christmas Offering. Kindly make your check payable to WCPC and mark it for the Christmas Offering, as only checks designated as such as well as cash collected at the three Christmas Eve services will go toward this offering. Specially marked envelopes will also be available in the pew racks for your convenience. When we give out of the abundance of God's blessings in our lives, the light of Christ shines through us and illuminates those in need of help and hope. Thank you for your willingness to help support those in their hour of great need and hour of great promise.
