Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a special contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. The Alternative Market was a huge success!

This year the Mission Outreach Team (MOT) decided to try something new with the Alternative Market. They decided to have the market open to the public for two hours on Saturday morning. This proved to be a very good idea! We had teachers and families from ELP and All Ears! stop by as well as several people from the community that saw our tent signs on Panther Creek Drive or our notice on Woodlands Online. In addition, we had many church members come to shop at the more leisurely pace. Roughly 25% of the people who purchased items on Saturday were not WCPC members. For the two hours the market was open on Saturday, we took in \$7,000.



We had some new items and new mission outreach projects at the market this year. The Senior High youth sold hot chocolate mixes in adorable snowman jars they made as well as cute Santa mugs. All of these items were very well received as they were gone before 10:15 on Sunday morning! This was the first time we had a table for Kids' Meals and offered shoppers the opportunity to purchase a week's worth of food for a pre-schooler. The Sunday School children made a new soup mix this year called Curly Christmas Soup and the dresses made by the Prayers and Squares Ministry were for girls affected by the hurricanes in Florida and the fires in California.

Thanks to the generosity of all our shoppers over \$16,000 will be given to the various mission projects represented at the market.

The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. Join Our Homeless Count Team

How many people are homeless in Montgomery County? How are veterans, families, children and other vulnerable populations affected by homelessness? The Coalition for the Homeless in Houston leads the annual Homeless Count and Survey in Montgomery, Ft Bend and Harris counties to help answer these questions by conducting an annual Homeless Count & Survey.

The annual Point-in-Time Homeless Count is a requirement of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the local Continuum of Care (CoC) funding process, which brought more than \$35 million to our area in the FY 2017 application process. This funding provides permanent housing, supportive services, and planning funds to our community to assist persons experiencing homelessness with greater self-determination. The night of the Count will be Monday, January 21, 2019. On this night, shelter data will be pulled from the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), as well as sent in manually from organizations who do not participate in HMIS (such as the Montgomery County Women's Shelter). This data will be used as the sheltered homeless count. The unsheltered count will take place in our county on January 23 & 24, and will consist of volunteer outreach teams that will conduct brief, conversational surveys with individuals who slept unsheltered on the night of January 21. Teams will canvass their assigned areas between 6:30 am and 4:00 pm each of those days.

Thanks to everyone who donated stocking stuffers and to the women attending the Christmas Luncheon for stuffing the stockings for the veterans in transition at the De-George. We were able to provide stockings for all 100 residents in-

cluding two WWII Vets. Each stocking contained several travel size toiletries, a full size deodorant, one toothbrush, two disposable razors, a pair of socks, drink & popcorn packets, several pieces of candy and a fun item such as a puzzle book. Roger Foxall, the advocate for the De-George, delivered the stockings along with 26 bags of Just Coffee, fourteen blankets and sixteen twin sheet sets, which were purchased using funds donated at the Alternative Market, to the director of the facility to use/distribute when needed.

WCPC Food Pantry Needs for January

The Mission Outreach Team voted to expand the Interfaith Food Pantry located in the sanctuary narthex beginning in 2019. In addition to collecting food for the Interfaith Food Pantry there is now one shelf dedicated to the food being collected for both Kids' Meals and Meals on Wheels. And so, the armoire has a new sign above it which says WCPC Food Pantry. Through this expansion we will now be able to serve many more of our neighbors in need especially the two groups, which are often overlooked: preschool children who don't benefit from school lunch programs and homebound seniors.
