

Dear WCPC family:

Who are we? While there are more than just these five let me share five things which I believe define who we are as Presbyterians.

First leadership in the Presbyterian Church is something we share in together. As your pastor I certainly have influence, but ultimately the decisions made about this church are made by your Session, which is composed of leaders you have elected to serve. What your Session seeks is not to do what I want them to do, not to do what you want them to do, but together to seek to discern what does God want us to do. We listen to each other. We listen to God as we read Scripture. We listen to the witness of the Church through the Confessional statements that guide us. Then, we make decisions. We pray. We listen. We pray some more. Than we act.

Second Presbyterians are willing to take on tough issues. We don't just want to know the Biblical background of a passage, we want to know what does that passage say to us today. How should we live in light of what God's Word is teaching? Now we don't always agree, but even in our disagreements we are seeking not our way but God's way, with humility, knowing that we could be wrong and the other person right.

Third Presbyterians seek to balance our need to care for each other with our need to care for others. We are saved "for salvation and service." As Presbyterians we believe God has called us to act responsibility as citizens, using our voice and vote to reflect what we believe God desires, not what we desire. We recognize that while we as a congregation, even a denomination can make an impact, one piece of just legislation (in Austin or in Washington) can make an even greater difference in the lives of millions.

We are committed to seeking justice for those who have been oppressed, whether they live half a world away or down the street. We take the words of Jesus in Matthew 25 as commands seriously: to feed the hungry, give drink to those who are thirty, welcome strangers clothe the sick, visit those in prison – reaching out to those who are marinized and oppressed, forgotten.

Fourth, while our worship should be attractive and appealing, ultimately as Presbyterians we believe that worship isn't about our needs being met. Worship is about bringing glory and honor to God.

And most importantly we hold the conviction that our salvation is God's gift to us, unearned, unmerited. And that all that we do, we do in response to what God has already done. We are not trying to win God's favor, because we have already received God's favor. We act out of gratitude, devotion and love.

Certainly invite conversation and discussion with you about these or other characteristics which define who we are as Presbyterians.

WCPC HOSTS A WEEKLY AA MEETING.


Each Monday at 7:00 pm in Hendricks 306 a local AA group is meeting. If you know of anyone who would like to attend please share this information.

As she neared her retirement in 2017, one of my mentors, Mary Marcotte, former Associate General Presbyter of New Covenant Presbytery, gave me her "Jesus Doll." I haven't found a great place for him to "live" yet, so he sits on a chair by my desk in my office. When young children have come by (namely my niece), I've watched them eying this doll. He's neither frightening nor funny to them. When I've asked who he is, I usually get confused or puzzled looks. Honestly, I'm not sure why I should expect a 2 or 3 year old to recognize some fabric artist's rendering of our Lord. Nevertheless, there he sits, watching over my theological library. These young ones have me wondering though- how often we actually recognize the presence of Christ in our midst. Who is this Jesus, anyway? That is one of the many ques-

tions of faith we get to explore together during this season between Christmas and Lent. We hear the stories of Christ's baptism and his call to ministry. We hear how his family, his friends, and his community began to respond to his calling. We are reminded time and again that his message of God's grace and will for our lives went far beyond Nazareth in Galilee, beyond Jerusalem and into the lives of many who were forever changed. In these weeks leading up to Ash Wednesday and Lent, I encourage you to ponder with the preschoolers and me, "Who is this Jesus; will I recognize his presence with me; and how will his life and ministry change my own?"



PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those in need who make requests to the pastors of WCPC. Primarily it is used to assist non-members, but on occasion funds are used to assist members with short-term needs. Individuals and families in the past have been helped with rent, utilities, car repair, and prescriptions. A person requesting aid meets with one of our pastors. Their needs are assessed and typically referrals are provided. As an example, if someone lives in the area supported by Interfaith of The Woodlands they are encouraged to contact Interfaith. Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a special contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. Please make certain that your check to WCPC notes that it is for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. If you would like more information, please don't hesitate to contact either of our pastors.

NCPC Book Club





DeGeorge at Union Station: Transitional Housing for Homeless Vets One of Our Mission Outreach Partners

The DeGeorge at Union Station is a 501C3 charity program, which provides housing and other services including mental and physical health, education, jobs, food and financial assistance for veterans. The average income for a vet residing at the DeGeorge is \$700 per month while 20% have no source of revenue. The annual turnover is approximately 23 veterans. There are currently 9 females and 91 males of which two are WWII vets living at the DeGeorge. The total SRO (single resident occupation) is always 100 with many names on a waiting list. The DeGeorge is always in need of basic supplies to give to its residents such as: bedding, blankets, towels, personal hygiene and food items.

In 2018, WCPC was able to supply 100 Christmas stockings (one for each resident) containing personal hygiene and food items along with a magazine and fun item. At the Alternative Market enough funds were raised to provide 14 new sheet sets and 37 blankets. Also, 24 pounds of Just Coffee purchased at the Alternative Market were donated to the DeGeorge. Some of the Benevolence money allocated to the DeGeorge was used to purchase a gas card for the 15 year old passenger van (which gets 10 MPG) used to transport the vets to their various appointments. All the donations WCPC gives to the DeGeorge are very much appreciated.





The Gathering Place Friday, February 15th 10:00am to 1:00pm (Lunch is provided) WCPC Fellowship Hall

The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs will vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. 


