Dear Ones,

Throughout scripture we find many images and names for God. Tradition has often led us to emphasize the images of God as Father. For many, this is comforting and assuring. For others, it can be painful and problematic. However, we know that God is far bigger than any image or name we use. This is why I try to pray using a variety of names for the divine. I have my favorites, the ones I resonate with most. I know you do too. There are two Sundays where I will use some gendered language for God. I speak of God's mothering characteristics on Mother's Day and the paternal characteristics of God on Father's Day. I say all this as prologue, because a number of you requested my Prayers of the People from Mother's Day, May 12. I have included it below. I cannot take full credit for many of these wise words. I regularly use and adapt them from resources like the *Feasting on the Word Worship*

Companion and Call to Worship. I also must give credit to the Rev. Dr. Catherine Robinson, my supervisor and mentor during my seminary Supervised Practice of Ministry. Over the years I have adapted her wise prayer for Mother's Day, using elements in the prayer below.

Risen and Holy One, As a mother loves and cares for her own, so you have loved and cared for us, O God. We praise you for giving us birth, for feeding and protecting us, for releasing us into the world, for continuing to watch over us and for longing to see the promise of our lives fulfilled. We thank you for your shepherding care which nourishes and sustains us.

We thank you for all of those in our lives who have reflected your love for us—for those who brought us into the world and shaped our early lives, for those who have nurtured us and taught us, who have wept for us in our defeats and rejoiced with us in our victories.

We thank you for the goodness of the earth, that it may flourish with flowing waters, green pastures, and paths that lead us to protect and care for your creation.

Touched by your maternal care for us, we pray now for your world and all its children. We pray for the peace and welfare of the world, that all our tables of work and worship promote the understanding and dignity that transform enemies into friends. Protect those who are attacked or persecuted because of who they are or what they believe. Provide for the peace and safety of all people. Strengthen and uphold those who sacrifice their own health and well-being in order to feed and clothe their children. Give shelter to those who have no homes. Feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty. Guide them to the springs of the water of life and wipe away every tear from their eyes. Especially we pray for the people of this whole world as we hear continual reports of and experience acts of senseless violence. Bring an end to our desire to do harm to one another because of wrongs done to us, because of fear of others, because of desperation.

On this day on which we celebrate mothers and motherhood, we pray for those who now wait with joy for the birth of a child, for women who long to bear children but who cannot, for those who are in the midst of the joys, challenges and sleepless nights of caring for young children, for those who remember with fondness days long past when their children were small, for those who have given children over to the hands of others through adoption, for those who care for children to whom they have not given birth, for those whose children are sick or dying, and for those who grieve the loss of their children, for those who mourn the loss of their mother, for those who celebrate the closeness they have in their relationship with their mothers for those who have difficult and painful relationships with their mothers, for those who have loved us, guided us and nurtured us with your mothering care.

Tender God, we pray that you would shelter under your wing all those in need of your healing care. Walk with those who are in dark valleys. Comfort them and protect them from harm. Show them your goodness and mercy. Bring your healing to those who struggle under the weight of illness of body, mind or spirit. Be merciful to those who need your care; let them hear your voice and know that they are yours, precious, chosen, and beloved.

Mothering God, keep us working and praying for the coming of your holy realm of peace, when we will share abundant life with you. Amen.



The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30 am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. Since WCPC has committed to helping the Kids' Meals Expansion Route provide lunches for the 50 children signed up through the Willis Parental Support Center, we will continue to pack shelf-stable lunches throughout the summer. That is, we will pack at least 250 shelf-stable lunches on the **second and fourth Mon**days of the month beginning at 9:30 am in the serving **area of the kitchen.** Lunches will be picked up for delivery to the Willis Parental Support Center at 1pm the next day (the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month). After the lunches are packed, we plan to pack breakfast bags for MOW clients. We hope to be able to pack at least 100 breakfast bags each time. 



Come join us the second Monday of each month in the WCPC Library (in the Hendricks Education Building) at 7pm.


The selections for the summer are:




