

Dear WCPC family,

We are in the middle of the Lenten season and longing for the "Alleluias" of Easter. But Lent is important. Confession as they say is good for the soul. It really is. Confession for our actions or lack of actions or our failure, not just as citizens but as disciples, to recognize the consequences that decisions made on our behalf have on the least among us.

The most recent example was the winter freeze that we just lived through. Well, most of us did. Some did not. I shared this in my message following the freeze and I want to repeat t it now. As Texans, but more importantly as disciples of Christ, we must demand that our elected leaders act to prevent such an avoidable tragedy from happening again. I'm glad to see some have moved in that direction but I know how it goes. The further we get away from the event, well, people forget and move on. Let's not let that happen. While

most of us will recover, those who were vulnerable before are even more vulnerable now.

We continue, now over a year later, to live in the shadow of Covid. Over 500,000 deaths and the numbers of those who have died continues to grow. There is hope. More and more members of WCPC are being vaccinated. More and more of our neighbors as well. But now is not the time to let our guard down. One life is too high a price to pay for some temporary inconveniences.

Prayerfully we will learn important, live saving lessons, from the winter freeze as well as Covid. However if we deny the reality that serious mistakes were made we will only be inviting more such events in the years, decades to come. As I said in my sermon after the freeze. It's not about scoring political points or placing blame. There is enough to go around. Instead let us acknowledge the truth, embrace the reality, and act appropriately. That will be my prayer for our nation and for disciples who are called to be vocal in supporting policies and actions that impact the "least among us." And of course if our personal and corporate decisions impact the "least among us" it will also bless us as well who aren't.

You will see in this newsletter our plans for Holy Week and Easter. Whether you attend in person or watch the live stream my prayer, our prayer, will be that Holy Week and the season of Easter which follows, will remind us again of God's love and presence among us and God's ability, even in the midst of a freeze and Covid, to bring forth hope and life.

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those in need who make requests to the pastors of WCPC. Primarily it is used to assist non-members, but on occasion funds are used to assist members with short-term needs. Individuals and families in the past have been helped with rent, utilities, car repair, and prescriptions. A person requesting aid meets with one of our pastors. Their needs are assessed and typically referrals are provided. As an example, if someone lives in the area supported by Interfaith of The Woodlands they are encouraged to contact Interfaith. Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a special contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. Until that time, I know that you will continue to be creative, resilient, compassionate, and patient with yourselves, your leaders, your staff, and your church. Know that we are doing the same. Until that time when we can safely gather for a shared meal, Bible study, fellowship, or even a hug, know that you are in our hearts and our prayers. We are thankful for you. We are proud of you. We love working and serving with you.


WCPC SINGS TUESDAYS AT 2PM

Love Your Neighbor Month was a Success!

Due to the pandemic, the Mission Outreach Team (MOT) was not able to hold the traditional one-day mission blitz at the end of January called Love Your Neighbor Day. The team decided instead to offer various mission opportunities throughout the month of February, which ranged from passive activities such as donating money for the Souper Bowl of Caring to benefit Kids' Meals Montgomery County Expansion Route (over \$1,400 was collected) to more active projects of assembling and delivering 246 Breakfast Bags to Meals on Wheels clients. All in all, the new format, Love Your Neighbor Month, was very successful.

Thirty one-pound bags of Just Coffee were ordered in an effort to not only obtain some delectable coffee for personal use, but also to help our neighbors in Mexico address poverty and migration issues. Twenty Birthday Bags were provided to the elderly and disabled residents of Tamarac Pines born in the month of February and Valentine's Day goody bags along with Walmart gift cards were distributed to all 100 residents of the DeGeorge, which provides a "forever home" to formerly homeless veterans. Volunteers staffed a valentine-themed Gathering Place Drive-through while others donated items for the goody bags that were given to each participant. Even All Ears! students and the ELP Bluebird class helped out by making valentines for the goody bags and decorating Breakfast Bags, respectively. Others helped from their own home decorating bags for Kids' Meals and Meals on Wheels or crocheting soap bags and washcloths for Seafarers and the homeless. In addition, a couple hundred pounds of soft goods were collected for recycling with the proceeds going to the Community Assistance Center. The opportunity to learn more about the NAACP Chapter in Montgomery County was offered to our community through a Social Justice Forum Program and at our February 28th Blood Drive 23 donors provided 26 units of blood which means 78 lives saved! MOT extends a heartfelt thank-you to all those who helped our neighbors near and far in need.













Peru Medical Scholarship



A little over a year ago, we learned that one of the children, Oscar Guidotti, Jr., of a long time Peru Mission co-worker in Lima earned admittance to medical school at the Universidad Ricardo Palma de Lima Perú. Many of us have known Oscar Jr. since he was 5 or 6 years old and have watched him grow up into a fine young man. Over the past few years, Oscar Jr has been learning English and volunteering with us in the Peru Mission Medical Clinic.





Oscar Jr finished secondary school last year and applied to medical school. When we learned that he'd received early admittance, a scholarship fund was established at WCPC to support his continuing education and journey toward becoming a doctor. He just completed his first year in January.

Classes, which were originally scheduled to start in March last year, were postponed until the end of April due to the pandemic. His entire first year was conducted online and the outlook for his second year, which begins in April, is the same.

It will take six more years in medical school for Oscar Jr. to become a doctor. She pastored a church in Ndola, in the Copperbelt of Zambia, before her denomination decided to send her to Justo Mwale to obtain her BTh degree. She is in her twenties, single and sends her heartfelt thanks to those who have helped, and are helping, her to further her studies. 

2020 Through Our Mission Outreach Partner's Eyes



We are grateful for WCPC's support, and would like to provide an update on some of the ways PCHAS was able to continue serving children and families in need in 2020. PCHAS serves more than 4,500 children and families each year and we provide Christ-centered care and support for children and families in need. Our vision is to strive to serve like Jesus and meet our clients where they are. We treat our clients

with respect and focus on their strengths rather than their problems, and encourage them to focus on their future rather than their past. Ultimately, we help children and families find hope and know the love of God.

COVID-19 dramatically changed the logistics of how we provided services in 2020, but it did not change our ability to provide critical care to children and families in need. When we were given orders to stay home we immediately began to use telehealth in all programs. We have been able to help our families with parenting strategies for staying at home, and activities to provide connection and fun during a stressful time. We have also been able to help our families ensure that they stay mentally and emotionally healthy as well as physically healthy. In our programs where licensing required that we begin to have in-person contact with our clients we ensured staff had proper personal protective equipment (PPE) and followed CDC guidelines.

In the Houston area, we are happy to report that we completed adoptions for 63 children in 2020, which is a remarkable number, considering that courts were closed for large parts of the year. Our Single Parent Family Program in Houston served 10 families with 18 children and provided 2,062 family nights in care. Our Child and Family program served 65 children. Because of your support through our annual Angel Tree Project, we were able to bring Christmas for over150 kids in the Houston area!

In other areas of Texas, we've been moving forward with ongoing projects to increase our level of support for children in need. In 2021 we will be completing our San Antonio Campus expansion where we will welcome 16 Single Parent Families and 5 Transitional Living young adults to PCHAS. We currently have families waiting for each home plus an active waitlist. In North Texas, we started a program called Growing Together, helping families with children from 0 to 5 yrs with support and education. The Growing Together program even won an award for the Best Collaborative Program in Navarro County. We hope that one day we can move this program to other areas of the state.

Looking forward to 2021, we will be having the following two virtual events for our Houston area programs: 1) Houston Foster Care and Adoption Info Session where our Program Director will be talking more in depth about our Foster Care and Adoption program and answering frequently asked questions. This event will be online on Tuesday, March 9th at 12pm. 2) Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services' Annual Luncheon: Our luncheon will be virtual again this year. We are sorry that we can't meet in person, but are excited to feature incredible stories from two of our adoption parents, telling their journey to becoming a family.
