Dear WCPC family,

I preached recently John 21: 1-19 and titled the message "The Last Breakfast." It's a challenging text since, it seems, only two weeks after the first Easter, at least six disciples are back in Galilee and instead of shouting "Jesus Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed!" They are back in their boats fishing. Back where Jesus first found them.

Their resurrected Lord shows up. Helps them with their fishing since they weren't very good fishermen. Then he has breakfast ready for them. We aren't told what they discussed over fried fish but afterwards Jesus asks Peter, who had denied Jesus three times before the cross,

three questions.

"Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." <sup>16</sup>A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." <sup>17</sup>He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep." (John 21: 15 -17)

What if Jesus were asking us those questions? One thing to say it we do. Another to live it out. Guest what? Just like Jesus understood Peter and those other disciples who went fishing. He understands us.

He understands the struggle and the difficult of putting him and his Kingdom above everything and everyone else, most of all ourselves. He knew that Peter, even after this encounter, would still struggle with his own discipleship (Acts 10).

Yet knowing that. Knowing how little Peter really understood. Knowing us and how little we understand. Jesus still wants Peter to follow him.

In fact, according to Matthew and Mark's gospel those were the first words that Peter heard from Jesus – "Follow me." Now they are some of the last words he will hear from him. "Follow me."

Jesus still says to us "Follow me."

What can we expect? Joy. Purpose. Community. But also struggle. Not just with those who don't agree with our values or vision but struggle within ourselves.

And we will fail him. And we may desert him at times. Forget who and whose we are and maybe take our own fishing trip to sort of forget about it all.

But he won't desert us. He won't forget us. He continues to call to us "Follow me."

#### PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND



## Investing in Youth: Our Greatest Resource




Help youth begin life with a solid foundation of faith.

Psalm 71 testifies that a foundation of faith established during childhood helps ensure lifelong faith and service. The patterns and lessons established during these formative years continue to bear fruit throughout a person's life. By giving to the Pentecost Offering, you are nurturing the faith of those who are the church to come — children, youth, and young adults.

PRINTED THE STATE OF THE STATE

This year's local offering will go to The Montgomery County Food Bank (MCFB) - Backpack Buddy Program. MCFB works with over fifty schools to help feed the food insecure in Montgomery County. Kids in need usually receive free or reduced-price lunch at school; however, that does not address what happens at dinner time and on the weekends. The reality is that many of these kids are only eating at school during the week and eating very little on the weekends. MCFB works directly with the schools to identify the kids in most need and enroll them in our Backpack Buddy Program. The program provides an 8-10 pound bag of food that goes home with each child each weekend. It's usually enough food to provide several meals for the child and also contains food that benefits the entire family. They currently help about 1000 children per week in our local schools.

JUNE 5-11, 2022

After a 2 year pause because of Covid, WCPC is pleased to again be hosting Family Promise the week of June 5 to 11 at their new permanent facility in Conroe, which can now accommodate up to 6 families! We will not host on our campus as in previous years but will need to fill many of the same spots with volunteers as we have in the past. These positions will include evening meals, Saturday and Sunday breakfast, drivers, overnight hosts, as well as evening and weekend hosts. Other volunteer opportunities may be needed.

We will begin recruiting volunteers with a Faith in Action on May 8 followed by sign ups through Signup Genius and a table in the courtyard each Sunday in May. Coordinators will be needed in the planning process as in the past. A family just graduated from the program, so there is only one family currently. That is very likely to change before our week in June since Family Promise has several families they are currently interviewing!

#### About the Mission

Family Promise helps local communities coordinate their compassion to address the root causes of family homelessness. They address the issue holistically, providing prevention services before families reach crisis, shelter and case management when they become homeless, and stabilization programs once they have secured housing to ensure they remain independent. FP taps existing local resources to empower families towards economic stability. Families come to FP in crisis; they help them rebuild their lives with new skills and ongoing support.

# Order Your Fresh Roasted Just Coffee MAY 15-29TH

From May 15-29, 2022 you will have the opportunity to have a direct impact on our brothers and sisters in Mexico by ordering one-pound bags of this delectable coffee for your home enjoyment. As in the past if you would like to donate five-pound bags of coffee to Compassion United or DeGeorge at Union Station those options will be on the order form. Our mission partners remain very appreciative of these gifts! Orders can be placed online through the WCPC website starting on May 15!

#### Just Coffee: Caffeine with a Conscience

As its name implies, Just Coffee (Café Justo) is about justice and equality! This coffee grower cooperative based in Salvador Urbina, Chiapas, Mexico that is guided by four key principles: Financial Transparency, Organic and Sustainable Production Practices, Consensus Decision Making and Fair and Just Treatment of all cooperative members, workers, suppliers, and clients. These requirements exceed those of Fair Trade and so it is referred to as Fair Trade Plus! According to its founder and director, Daniel Cifuentes, the mission of Café Justo is to reduce the amount of migration to the United States, and they believe this is the best way to convince young families to stay in Mexico. So Just Coffee is also about the self-development of people!





Café Justo is made from 100% Arabica, Robusta and Marago beans which are organically grown, with no chemical fertilizers or pesticides. The coffee trees are cultivated beneath shade trees which allows for a better tasting, more environmentally friendly coffee.

Cultivated at altitudes between 4,000 and 5,000 feet, this coffee is grown on the side of a 13,333 foot volcano known as Tacaná. Ideal conditions for a coffee tree include high humidity, shade, temperatures from 65 to 80 degrees F and plentiful precipitation. All of these qualities are characteristic of Salvador Urbina, Chiapas, Mexico. With the combination of the volcanic soil of Tacaná, the high altitude of the region, abundant rain, organic techniques and shade tree cultivation method, this coffee has an excellent aroma and a highly memorable taste. Cafe Justo coffee is roasted in Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico.

Through its partnership with the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the Houston Food Bank receives more than 400,000 jars of fresh peanut butter each year from the LDS Peanut Butter Cannery. The Food Bank is responsible for supplying volunteers and paying for the peanuts used. Volunteers help produce 3,960 jars of peanut butter in each 4-hour shift. Tasks include sorting the nuts, checking lids on jars, operating the label machine, and packing jars in boxes.

# WCPC Supports Ukraine relief efforts through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA)

Through the WCPC Disaster Relief Fund \$4,735 was donated towards PDA's ongoing efforts in the Ukraine.

Violence continues to displace Ukrainians who flee their homes to neighboring cities and countries. In the midst of the chaos, sibling churches and ecumenical partners are already providing assistance with basic items for survival.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing urgent funding to trusted, established partners having the expertise to carry out humanitarian aid. Reformed and Orthodox church partners, like the Community of St. Egidio and Hungarian Reformed Church Aid, are working closely with local churches and organizations to provide food, water, clothing, shelter, psychosocial support and other basic items for survival. They are the "boots on the ground," listening and responding to the needs of those impacted.

# Kids' Meals lunch program continues through the summer

In the summer months, every child up to age 18 in food-insecure homes require support. Every child in the homes with pre-schoolers already supported by Kids' Meals receives a meal. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30 am to noon.

The Gathering Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch.

A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you. 


