Dear WCPC,

How we love our freedom in this country. The 4th of July is a celebration of it. I love this country. I love the freedom that I have had since my birth. Yet for many, in the past, and even today, freedom is a word not a reality.

We did enslave Africans brought here by force to work and serve our needs. They had no freedom until 1865. Even after receiving it certain states passed what were known as Jim Crow laws to make certain freedoms more difficult to attain. Native Americans who lived in North America long before any European came were rounded up and moved forcibly to res-

ervations far from their ancestral lands. And of course, there are others stories. Stories from the past and even the present in the on going struggle for freedom.

What I have just written is a part of our actual history. It's our story. It can't be rewritten to make it more acceptable, nor should it be. The United States is a great nation because we seek to learn from our history and not repeat the sins of the past. Of course, that struggle continues today since freedom is not just difficult to achieve but also to keep.

As disciples our freedom is never understood as demanding our rights. We live in submission to God's will. Jesus Christ is Lord. But in that there is freedom. The freedom of becoming, growing in our relationship with God. Becoming more and more like Christ in how we see ourselves and others. Freedom, purpose, meaning that is found as we seek to make a difference in the lives of others, especially as Jesus and the Old Testament prophets remind us, the least among. Those who are neglected. Those who have no power. Those who lack freedom.

I'm grateful that some of my professors at the Presbyterian seminary I attended were involved in the civil rights movement. Their stories and their willingness to sacrifice was a witness to me. Continues to be a witness.

Change takes time and comes slowly. Some in the past who struggled to give others a taste of freedom never saw the fruit of their labor. It is slow, and at times, since it's a frightening to others as it upsets the status quo, it can go in the other direction as well.

In 1940, Rabbi Jacob Kohn in Los Angeles said "Our faith is kept alive by the knowledge, founded on long experience, that **the arc of history is long and bends toward justice.**" He told his audience at Temple Sinai, "We have seen so many ancient tyrannies pass from earth since Egypt and Rome held dominion that our eyes are directed not to the tragic present, but to the beyond, wherein the arc of history will be found bending toward justice, victory and freedom."

I believe it does. And I also believe that people of faith, like you and me, help it bend!

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

Dear Ones,

You have probably heard or read my rhapsodies about summer camp more than once, BUT as it is summer, I am more nostalgic about my formative camp experiences.

The summer before I entered 3rd grade I packed a bag as my mother dutifully checked off items on the packing list. Clothes that can get messy- check. Toiletries in a ditty bag- check. River shoes- check. Sunscreen and insect repellant- check. Flashlight- check. Paper, envelopes, and stamps (please make sure your camper knows how to address envelopes or that you send envelopes that are pre-addressed)-check. Over the next week, I swam in a lake, rode horses, did crafts, sang songs, ate s'mores. My first

time at overnight camp was a success, and I went back to Camp Fire camp each of the next three summers. However, it wasn't until two summers later that I learned what a truly good (for me) camp experience was like.

This shy, anxious almost 6th grader went reluctantly to John Knox Ranch, because my sister really wanted to go, but not by herself. I'll admit, I pouted a little as I made up my bunk in Oak Grove. I'd just realized that my sister and I would be on opposite sides of the camp, and would probably only see each other at meals. By dinner that first night, I knew something was different about this place. By snack the next afternoon, I knew I'd found a place that felt like home. Even though the only person I knew when the session started was my annoying little sister, my counselors, then my cabin-mates, then the camp cook, made me feel welcome. But it was more than welcome. I knew that I was loved, trusted, valued for myself. I didn't have to be smart, or do all the jobs that no one else wanted to in order to be liked. I could ask questions that would have only gotten laughter at my other camp, especially questions about God. I didn't have to be the best runner or canoer or tie-dyer or pretend to like horses, I just had to be me... the real me. I could be the silly, happy tween I so wanted to be. I didn't come with a club of friends, but I left with a cabin full of besties from all over Texas.

I returned each summer for at least a week, and begged my parents to let me attend the longer sessions as soon as I was old enough. For the next 10 summers my schedule was planned around my time at camp- as a camper, a jr. counselor, a cooks assistant, and finally as a counselor. I found friends. I found God. I found my voice. I found my call to ministry. It meant so much I even returned as a chaplain one summer in seminary.

Camp can be a magical, wonderful, God-filled place and time for our kids and youth. Camp can and does change lives. I know it changed mine. So, this summer, I have been praying for our kids and youth as they go to camp and to youth conferences. I pray they meet and are met by our wonderful God. I pray they are welcomed and welcome others into communities that love them... the real them. I pray they have the chance to laugh, and be silly, and find their voice. I pray their lives are changed, even if it's only for a week. I hope you'll join me in this prayer.



Kids' Meals is a first responder to children age 5 and under facing debilitating hunger due to extreme poverty. Every weekday, year-round, volunteers prepare healthy lunches consisting of a sandwich, nutritious snack, fruit item, and 100% juice or milk. The van delivers the meals to children in Montgomery County enrolled in the program.

Our WCPC Advocate, Ingrid Fowler, sees that the needs are growing and more children could be served if there was more support. She is eager to do her part--she helps out Kids' Meals in various ways weekly. Also twice per month Fowler along with Sally Shu and a group of WCPC volunteers join together to assemble 400 Kids' Meals bags per month. Fowler believes the group could do more- she would like to see the number of bagged Kids' Meals go up to 600 bagged meals per month. Thanks to a generous memorial gift and a grant awarded to WCPC by Presbytery of New Covenant, that wish can come true. Both gifts will go towards Kids' Meals, Meals on Wheels and Compassion United breakfast and lunch bag program at WCPC.


Kids' Meals Director, Laran Cone recently reflected on all of the activities they have had over the last few months. "We had a Christmas party, families were sponsored for Christmas and we delivered Easter baskets. We hosted a lunch bag decorating and packing night with local Veterans and their families. We hosted a Golf tournament fundraiser. We continue to have amazing volunteers helping at all these events and who continue each week making sandwiches and packing lunches."

Kids' Meals MOCO Expansion Route will be moving into their new space this summer. Cone says, "This will allow us to expand to East county soon with a new driver to cover that area. It's a busy time as we are adding new families every week." WCPC has been a constant source of support and breakfast meals. "We are so appreciative of all of the support from The Woodlands Community Presbyterian Church since the beginning. We absolutely could not do it without the support we have received!"

2022 Peru Mission Trip



WCPC will be joining First Presbyterian Church — Kingwood as they restart their annual mission trips to the barrios of Lima Peru after a two-year hiatus. The team will return to La Vizcachera, departing July 22 and returning July 30, where they will provide both a medical clinic and vacation bible school.

The Gathering Place of The Woodlands at WCPC is a ministry for those who are living with memory loss and the people who love and care for them at home. The Gathering Place seeks to help both the care partner and the caregiver. If you or someone you know are caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's, stroke, Parkinson's, or other dementia, you know that caregivers often find it difficult to do things such as run errands, visit friends, or just have free time alone. The Gathering Place provides the caregiver a few hours of free time or they may choose to participate along with their care partner or they may attend Common Ground, a caregiver support group which meets in the WCPC Parlor from 10:30 am to noon. The Gatherina Place provides a time of fun activities and fellowship in a safe, caring environment for the care partner during a time where it may be difficult for a caregiver to find appropriate social activities for their loved one with memory loss. The monthly programs vary, often featuring a festive theme to help the care partner identify with the current season, event or holiday. In a fun, interactive atmosphere, our volunteers offer music, games, chair exercises, crafts, reminiscing, guest performers, and a light lunch. A representative from CarePartners or our care team helps determine if we can meet the family's need with our program. This is done by arranging for the caregiver and the care partner to attend The Gathering Place together for the first visit. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you.




