## **Pueblo Memories**

Editor's note: The following piece, provided by Bridich Saragos, Associate Director of the Migrant Resource Center in Agua Prieta, Sonora, is challenging. She uses a poem by Rubí Celia Huerta Norberto to express the human connection to one's place, one's pueblo. The poem is in the poet's indigenous language— Purépecha—and is provided along with a translation into Spanish and a subsequent translation into English. You can imagine that Bridich, as a native speaker of Purépecha, understood the original intent of the poet; yet, as it was translated through the languages, it tended to lose some of its original "melody" and purpose. But Bridich's understanding and message is clear.



Rubí Celia Huerta Norbeto is an original native to the municipality of Chilchota, Michoacán. She is a historian, linguistics professor, and IndoAmerican writer in her maternal tongue, the Purépecha language, that has been her source of inspiration.

When we speak of our *pueblo*\* it brings to mind the smells, colors, streets, scenery, poverty, among other things, and probably the faces of our family members. (*Translator's note: "pueblo" means both the physical place and the humans who inhabit it*).

When our migrant brothers and sisters find themselves in the desert, they recall their *pueblo* and their home with nostalgia. When in foreign lands, perhaps dying, they regain strength as they think about why they are there. Some decide that it is better for them to return home and enjoy their families; their motivations and their reasoning change in the face of difficult moments.
