



Dear WCPC family,

I've been asked several times over the years why WCPC doesn't have an operating budget established before the new year? It is intentional. Your session, which sets the budget, needs to see how we ended the previous year financially. Additionally, we also want to give those who have not made a pledge/commitment an opportunity to do so before we set a budget which is driven by financial commitments. We do receive commitments in January.

Once the Finance Team has the needed information they first close out the previous year with a final report to the Session. At the same meeting they also review, for a second time,

the asking budgets for the teams of Session as well as financial commitments received. With this information they then, with prayer, recommend to the Session an operating budget for that year. At the January stated meeting of the new year the Session reviews the previous year and after discussing the Finance Team's recommendation acts on adopting an operating budget for the current year.

As a reminder in the Presbyterian Church USA the congregation does not approve the budget. The operating budget is approved by the Session. There is one exception. The Session can only recommend to the Session new terms of call for pastors. If the Session makes a recommendation on terms of call (salary, housing, etc.) then a congregational meeting is called to either approve or disapprove.

When you take into account the holiday season that ends the year, I hope you agree this approach makes sense. Once the budget is approved it takes effect retroactively to the first of the year. If changes in terms of call are made the same is true for them. The ongoing ministry and mission of WCPC continues without interruption.

The Finance Team will meet soon. Following their meeting and recommendations the Session at its stated meeting in January will adopt a budget for 2023 and make any recommendations to the congregation concerning terms of call that are necessary.

I invite you to remember the Finance Team and the Session in your prayers over the coming weeks. If you have not made a financial commitment to WCPC please prayerfully consider doing so in the coming days.

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those in need who make requests to the pastors of WCPC. Primarily it is used to assist non-members, but on occasion funds are used to assist members with short-term needs. Individuals and families in the past have been helped with rent, utilities, car repair, and prescriptions. A person requesting aid meets with one of our pastors. Their needs are assessed and typically referrals are provided. As an example, if someone lives in the area supported by Interfaith of The Woodlands they are encouraged to contact Interfaith. Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. Please make certain that your check to WCPC notes that it is for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. If you would like more information, please don't hesitate to contact either of our pastors.




WCPC VOLUNTEER MEAL PACKING CHANGES

Lenten Fast: Single Use Plastics

Many plastics products have changed our lives for the better. However, the polluting effects of single-use plastics are increasing. We see shopping bags that grace our trees, roads, and waterways. Single use bottles are thrown into the trash, instead of recycling, wasting valuable resources:

Millions of animals are killed by plastics every year, from birds to fish to other marine organisms. Nearly 700 species, including endangered ones, ... have been affected by plastics. Nearly every species of seabird eats plastics.

The solution is to prevent plastic waste from entering rivers and seas in the first place... This could be accomplished with improved waste management systems and recycling, better product design that takes into account the short life of disposable packaging, and reduction in manufacturing of unnecessary single-use plastics. (National Geographic 6/7/2019)

By far the best way to prevent the negative effects of single-use plastics is to reduce the demand for them. We can readily stop using them ourselves and we can raise our own awareness and the awareness of others. As an example, WCPC has recently installed water dispensers for refilling reusable bottles. These are located now in the Education Building (ELP) and the Narthex of the Fellowship Hall. The dispensers encourage the use of reusable water bottles by ELP children and others on our campus.

A Lenten Fast: Because we are a certified Earth Care Congregation and have pledged to encourage environmentally friendly actions, WCPC will observe and encourage a Lenten Fast of single use plastics, especially plastic water bottles and grocery bags. For six weeks from Ash Wednesday, February 22 to the day before Easter, April 8, we encourage the use of reusable water bottles and reusable shopping bags



The Benefits of Reusable Shopping Bags

If you are not currently using reusable bags for at least some of your routine shopping, now is the perfect time to give it a try! The ubiquitous plastic bags that we use to transport our groceries and other purchased goods to our homes have been a wonderful convenience to modern life. But like many other conveniences of modern life their use can harm our precious planet. These plastic bags are difficult to recycle (The Woodlands Township does not accept them in our recycle bins) and disposing of them in the trash sends them to a landfill where they take several decades to decompose. Some stores have collection bins at the entrance for recycling which is a better alternative than the trash but the recycling process still requires energy for separation and processing that could be better used elsewhere. So, give reusable bags a try! They only cost a couple of dollars, they are sturdy and will last a long time, each bag holds more items, they are easier to pack, transport, and unpack, and you will feel great that you're a part of a major collective effort for the benefit of our planet. (Pro tip: there are also insulated bags, the perfect solution to get the Blue Bell ice cream home without melting during our long Texas summers).
