## Zerubabel's Story

Zerubabel worked as a truck driver in Kenya. A horrific accident left him on the side of the road and assumed dead. Thankfully a man from his village heard about the accident, found Zerubabel unconscious by the side of the road and took him to PCEA Chogoria Hospital, an MBF partner in Kenya



After a week, Zerubabel regained consciousness. The team at Chogoria hospital began the difficult work of restoring as much mobility and function for Zerubabel as possible. After bone grafts, multiple surgeries, and lengthy rehabilitation, Zerubabel walked out of the hospital over a year after his accident. Today he returns to the hospital on occasion to encourage others who are suffering.



Surgeons, anesthetists, and skilled critical care nurses are in desperately short supply in lower- and middleincome countries. This is the impetus for the Surgical Network approach MBF is developing among mission hospitals in countries like Kenya.



### DEVELOPING SUSTAINABLE MEDICAL MISSION Malawi Surgical Network

9 out of 10 people in lower and middle-income countries lack access to safe and affordable surgical care. In Malawi, 1/3 of the population have a condition today that requires surgery to improve but they are unlikely to receive surgical care without our help. This is why **MBF is partnered with 5 mission hospitals and 24 clinics to create the first surgical network of its kind in Malawi.**

MBF and partners have planted an innovative seed in the surgical residency program at Nkhoma. From this beginning, the surgical network will grow to provide surgery services at

all five member hospitals including referrals from 24 clinics. In a country of nearly 20 million people served by fewer than 50 surgeons, the network will **radically improve the quality of care for millions of Malawians.** The residency recruits only doctors who already live and work in Malawi and who commit to going back to a mission hospital in Malawi to serve. In addition to training the surgeons, **MBF invests in the entire surgical network including training nurses to care for critically ill patients before and after surgery.** Helping the mission hospitals in Malawi develop a revenue-generating discipline like surgery serves patients today and makes the ministries more sustainable for the future. The Malawi surgical network pilot will be followed by surgical networks in 20 additional countries in the next 20 years.
