#### PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those in need who make requests to the pastors of WCPC. Primarily it is used to assist non-members, but on occasion funds are used to assist members with short-term needs. Individuals and families in the past have been helped with rent, utilities, car repair, and prescriptions. A person requesting aid meets with one of our pastors. Their needs are assessed and typically referrals are provided. As an example, if someone lives in the area supported by Interfaith of The Woodlands they are encouraged to contact Interfaith. Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. 

It's okay - they were doing an Energy Audit. What is that? It is like a checkup at the doc. They looked at how we use energy at WCPC. They examined our records and interviewed our staff. And they found some great ways that we can maintain comfort for our people and at the same time reduce our use of energy. And the bonus - it saves us money!

## Shining Light on Energy

In 2015-16, WCPC replaced incandescent and fluorescent lighting in most of the buildings with energy efficient LED lighting. These lights can reduce energy consumption by 75%! This is a big win for our budget and for the environment. Recently, WCPC again contracted with an energy expert who works with churches to reduce their energy use. The goal is to reduce carbon emissions through energy efficiency while saving on our energy bills. This is in line with the environmental overture adopted by the 225<sup>th</sup> PC(USA) General Assembly in July



2022. The overture recommends an environmental audit and the reduction of carbon emissions by 25 percent by 2030. In addition to energy efficiency accomplished with lighting, the heating and air conditioning systems (HVAC) are a major focus, particularly with the ways we manage our buildings. Successful reductions of energy use and carbon emissions rely on active involvement from all of us. Here are a few of the recommendations from the energy audit that we can accomplish:

- 1. Turn off lights when leaving a room;
- 2. Insulate hot water heaters and pipes:
- 3. Reduce heat and air conditioning usage through careful and focused thermostat control and scheduling (i.e., don't heat or cool unoccupied areas; don't overheat or overcool areas during the night; keep temperatures at reasonable levels; example setting at night for summertime unoccupied spaces 78°F).
- 4. Apply professional grade weather stripping around all exterior doors.

Our Noah's Ark Chapel was the highlight of the last week of school. Along with our Art in the Park event, it is wet, messy and so much fun!




We held our 2nd annual STEAM






