

Norma Jean (Angel) Pinnicks, 86, formerly of Wooster, Ohio, passed away suddenly on February 24, 2023 at her home in The Woodlands, Texas.

She was born on July 1, 1936 in Coshocton, Ohio, the daughter of the late Norma (Finnell) Angel Conrad, the late Arthur Angel, and the step-daughter of the late Charles "Coonie" Conrad.

Norma Jean, known as "Angie", graduated from Wooster High School in the Class of 1954. During her high school days, she was a cheerleader and synchronized swimmer, and worked as an Associate and hosiery buyer for the William Annat Company. After high school, she was a secretary for the Wooster City School Board of Education and Superintendent of Schools for five years.

Norma Jean and her high school "sweetheart", Paul Pinnicks were married on December 1, 1957, in Central Christian Church, Wooster, Ohio, by Dr. Rev. Bob Tuck. While raising their two children, Susan and Bill, Norma Jean had the privilege of being a stay-at-home mom which allowed her time to volunteer in her church activities. She was very active in Church life, especially in Christian Education. Norma Jean taught in the Church School (mainly 6th grade) for over 30 years. She used creative techniques incorporating plays, songs, puppets, and crafts to teach children about the Bible in ways they could understand. She was an ordained Elder and Deacon in both the Christian Church and later in The Woodlands Community Presbyterian Church, The Woodlands, Texas. She was a Stephen Minister, attended Monday morning Bible Study each week and volunteered in the church program called "The Gathering Place", providing support for people with Alzheimer/Dementia and their caregivers.

Norma Jean was a member of the Ladies 9-Hole Golf League at The Woodlands Country Club for 30 years. In 1998 she became a charter member of the P.E.O Sisterhood, Chapter HX in The Woodlands, Texas. She was also an inactive member of the Lakewood Emblem Club #346, Lakewood, Ohio.

She and husband, Paul, loved to travel. Several trips included: England, Scotland, Wales, and Ireland. She especially loved the tour of Turkey and Greece. She went on three mission trips to Mexico and a three-week mission trip to Africa with her church group. She enjoyed many cruises to the Caribbean and Alaska.

Norma Jean's passion and hobby was researching family Genealogy. She creatively reported her findings in scrapbook form, using pictures to tell the story of each person's life. Family was of utmost importance to her, and she was very proud of her husband and children, who she often referred to as her "Pride and Joy". She was a loving wife and mother who is remembered by all for her happy personality, warm smile, and sweet giggle. She always had kind uplifting words, and she made people feel special with her homemade cards for birthdays and special occasions.

Norma Jean is survived by her husband of 65 years, Paul Pinnicks, daughter Susan (John) Arbour, son William "Bill" (Carol) Pinnicks, granddaughters Cindy Pinnicks, Stephanie Pinnicks, and Kim (Jason) Zielinski, and great granddaughter, Tessa Zielinski; her brother Charles "Chuck" (Maggie) Conrad; brother-in-law Roger (Sandy) Pinnicks; sister-in-law Dottie Snyder; nephews Cy (Alissa) Conrad, Dan (Jennifer) Conrad and their families; nieces Julie (Tom) DeBord, Amy (Mike) Dunn, Lori (Nick) Adams, Debbie (James) Welch and their families.
