

### **PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND**

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those in need who make requests to the pastors of WCPC. Primarily it is used to assist non-members, but on occasion funds are used to assist members with short-term needs. Individuals and families in the past have been helped with rent, utilities, car repair, and prescriptions. A person requesting aid meets with one of our pastors. Their needs are assessed and typically referrals are provided. As an example, if someone lives in the area supported by Interfaith of The Woodlands they are encouraged to contact Interfaith. Your pastors have the discretion to assist those requesting financial help if they believe the need is legitimate and other avenues of help have been explored and are either not available or have been exhausted. If you would like to make a contribution to this fund you are invited to prayerfully consider doing so. Please make certain that your check to WCPC notes that it is for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. If you would like more information, please don't hesitate to contact either of our pastors.

If we do more to save energy use at WCPC, we can channel that money into our mission outreach. There are lots of ways we can make our campus more energy efficient. Want to know how? Just come to the workshop at **4:00 pm on February 4th** in the Sanctuary. It takes all of us to make this happen. So please plan to be there!

### Energy Savings = Money for Missions Sunday, February 4, 4 p.m. WCPC Sanctuary Presentation and Discussion, Colby May, CEM, author of the WCPC Energy Audit

We have an active program at WCPC on energy and environmental concerns. While we've accomplished a lot, the 2023 Energy Audit points out opportunities for doing more. The results of these actions will be more funds freed up for missions. We're calling this  $\mathbf{ES} = \mathbf{M}^2$  (Energy Savings Equals Money for Missions). The 2023 Energy Audit conducted by Colby May, Founder of Energy for Purpose, revealed how much more we can do. Toward this end, the Creation Care Team is organizing a presentation and discussion on the report findings planned for Sunday, February  $\mathbf{4}^{th}$  at 4:00 pm in the Sanctuary.

Since 2015, we have installed hundreds of LED light bulbs and fixtures. These improvements have largely paid for themselves by reducing electricity use. In addition, we replaced older outmoded and inefficient HVAC (Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning) systems with much more efficient units. This reduces our carbon footprint from emissions relevant to climate change as well as other harmful power plant pollutants. The added benefit for our church is saving money which can be used instead for missions, *Money for Missions*.

Conserving energy and reducing our bills requires all of us using the buildings to understand why and how to follow best practices for energy savings. Colby May will present findings and recommendations from the Energy Audit. The presentation will include time for questions and answers followed by refreshments. The presentation will focus on the WCPC campus, but the recommendations are also useful for our homes. The presentation will be recorded and live-streamed, so it can be viewed remotely, but we are encouraging people to attend in person and join the discussion.

In addition to WCPC leaders, members, and friends, we are inviting leaders of groups that use our buildings and other Earth Care Congregations in the Presbytery.






